

There was a need for a specific agency that would contribute to the breeding, multiplication and purification of these breeds that gave breeders the opportunity to have greater technical assistance on the best use of their livestock. Simbrah and Simmental cattle associations from different countries were contacted to obtain information on regulations and crossings and thus be able to form the Simbrah/Simmentals with a broader criteria. The task was not easy, but the constant struggle, dedication and support of such a unique group of farmers, made it possible for the Association of Simbrah and Simmental Cattle Breeders of Costa Rica to be founded on June 12, 1996. Then on February 2, 1999, the Office of the Association was opened.


Carlos Sanchez Castro, President of the ASO Simbrah, opened the event at a "welcoming reception". WSFF representative, Peter Wenn, was invited to the Americas Conference held on the second morning along with the delegate's reports. The Brazilian Simmentals completed a presentation on the different types of cattle in various parts of Brazil due to the different climates that make up the country. The country is breeding Simmentals to adapt to the different climates.

The WSFF Council meeting was held on the third day which was chaired by the two Vice Presidents — Sebastian Auernig (AT) and Peter Wenn (AUS) in the absence of the President, Fred Schuetze (USA). The new WSFF website is now up and running with the front home page being made up of Australian cattle footage. Access to the updated website can be seen at: wsff.info

Following the WSFF Council meetings, Peter Wenn attended a feedlot "Gandederia Colono Real" in Pococi (Limon Provice-Costa Rica), where they use open yards up to 1km in length to house the different ages of animals and are fed a ration of chaff, banana skins and pineapple leaves. They supply six to seven butchers, which in return, the feedlot receives a premium price and the balance of the animals go to the abattoirs for a lower price. The Livestock Manager, Sr. José Alberto Castillo Calvo, is dedicated to fattening pure cattle and has one of the most powerful farms in the country, producing meat and genetics.

Next on the agenda was a visit to an Al centre- Cigac, in San Carlos. The centre with its own laboratory and research centre is dedicated to improving animal genetics using cutting edge technology. They seek to increase the competitiveness of products lowering production costs in the livestock market based in genetic improvements. This state-of-the-art facility offers sexed embryos, DNA testing and semen evaluations.

Then onto the cattle judging of Simbrah and Simmentals on the last day which occurs on Costa Rica's Independence Day each year. The Simbrah and Simmental cattle being judged were certainly of quality as the judges and valuers congratulated the breeders and exhibitors for having the best of the breed on display. A thank you to all the organisers, exhibitors and international speakers of the different countries, for the great contribution to the activity, providing their knowledge and experience. The organisers of this event certainly made everyone feel welcome and should be proud of what they have achieved.

\$40,000 AT DUBBO

A top price of \$40,000 was a highlight of the 2019 third annual Simmental National Show and Sale at Dubbo, when the reserve junior champion bull bred in Victoria, came to Dubbo to be sold to South Australia.

The money-spinner, Mt Ararat Phoenix sold by John Leek, Mt Ararat stud, Nar Nar Goon, Vic, was purchased by Tom and Lizzy Baker for their Woonallee stud, Furner, SA, as the bull's dam, Woonallee Kathie B111, a donor cow within the Baker's herd had died, and Mr Baker said they needed to reintroduce the genetics to Woonallee.

Eleven of 17 Simmental bulls sold at auction average \$12,090 while eight of 14 stud females sold to \$8,000 and averaged \$4,875.

The two breeds combined to make one spectacular at Dubbo showground on Tuesday and Wednesday with judging on Tuesday by Robert Hutchinson of Long Gully Livestock, Feedlot, Rutherglen, assisted by associate judge, Chelsea Rayner, Kidman Down stud, Sheffield, Tasmania.

CHELSEA LEANS TOWARD SEEDSTOCK SALES CAREER

Chelsea Rayner has her eyes set on a seedstock agency career.

Currently studying Agricultural Science at University of Tasmania, Miss Rayner's interest in livestock sales began at school.

"It was probably nine years ago when I started the school program and assigned with some breeders, Reg and Rebecca Woodiwiss of Railton near Sheffield," she said. "Reg is a livestock agent with our agents, Webb and Woodiwiss Livestock Marketing, Tasmania, and just up the road.

"So there was always a bit of a pull there and I sort of always said from grade nine and 10 I think I want to have a go at it."

Miss Rayner was associate judge at the Red Angus and Simmental Nationals, Dubbo last week with Robert Hutchinson, a former custom fitting and stud stock transporter for 28 years, and now coordinating transport at the Long Gully Livestock short and domestic feedlot at Rutherglen, Victoria.

"I did a bit of work experience and really loved it," Chelsea said.
"I feel it is pulling me towards this career."

Together with her younger sister, Sarah, the Rayner girls run the Kidman Down Simmental and Shorthorn studs.

"I started the Simmentals six years ago with some Compton Park bloodlines," she said. "The majority of our work is artificial insemination and we've done a little bit of embryo transfer work which we'll use again to improve the herd.

"My sister was lucky enough to win a Shorthorn heifer at the 2017 Heifer Expo donated by the Williams family, Marrington Shorthorns, Dubbo, and the Shorthorn stud has come about from thore"

They calved 15 cows this year, the majority being Simmentals.

"We're running too many breeders according to my father," she said.

"So looking to bring back Simmental numbers to about 10.

They plan to cut back Simmental numbers this year to eight to 10, but increase Shorthorn numbers as well.

RIBBONS IN FOUR STATE SPREAD

Buyers of the senior and grand champion bull would be exceedingly happy to have him in their paddocks, according to the judge, Robert Hutchinson, at the 2019 Third Annual Simmental National Show at Dubbo last Tuesday.

Mr Hutchinson was praising 25-months-old Settler Nelson, a son of Woonallee Harry, bred and exhibited by Richard Wilkinson, Settler stud, Bringelly, and weighing 1034 kilograms at 25 months and displaying an eye muscle area (EMA) of 135 square centimetres and fat distribution of 10 millimetres at the rump and 9mm at the rib while carrying at 38cm scrotal circumference.

Mr Hutchinson of Long Gully Livestock feedlot, Rutherglen, Vic, officiated over 14 females and 16 bulls exhibited by 16 breeders from four states, with associate, Chelsea Rayner, Kidman Down Simmental and Shorthorn studs, Sheffield, Tasmania.

"He's such a big bull and floats around the ring. He's so relaxed he really knows this ring and holds his head up so easily. He's got real sire appeal," Mr Hutchinson said.

Savannah Simmentals of Vaughan and Sarah Campagnolo, Myponga, South Australia, took out junior champion bull award with Savannah Power Surge, a son of Wheatland Kill Switch.

Miss Rayner said Power Surge was a clear standout in terms of completeness and overall balance. "There's plenty of length and punch to him," she said.

Power Surge weighed 612kg at 15 months with an EMA of 120sqcm and SC of 36cm and is the first Kill Switch son to be shown in Australia.

Reserve senior champion bull was 25-month-old Springside Nano Man, by Aussie Park Jamie, shown by Peter and Toni Rauchle, Springside stud, Pittsworth, Queensland, while reserve junior champion award went to Mt Ararat Phoenix shown by John Leek, Mt Ararat stud, Nar Nar Goon, Vic.

Junior and grand champion female, Loaderry Poppy, by Tullatoola Just Right, was shown by Luke Adams, Londonderry, and highly praised by both judges.

Reserve junior, Hobbs Livestock Red Keepsake Summit a first daughter of Harvie Red Summit, was shown by Stuart and Kylie Hobbs, Molong.

Senior champion female was Rellum Farms Otty, by Woonallee Jackhammer, shown by Grantley and Vicki Muller, Rellum stud, Mount Gambier, SA.

However, even then it all had to be in a mad rush, and that is how Mervyn lived his life.

Merv's early years of schooling proved to be a struggle, however it was later worked out that his spoken word was far more efficient and articulate then his written word. Mervyn's sheer determination helped him overcome any obstacles in his way. He proved this by being an extremely intelligent young man who at times was capable of swearing better than anyone, just ask his cattle.

As Merv got older he started playing with the real deal, trading his toy Friesians for Bazadais and then later on his beloved Simmentals and his wooden cattle truck for a Daff XF. Merv started his Simmental Stud in 2008 which meant swapping green paint for green ear tags and his M brand for ZMU and this was how Lavarta Simmentals was known. Mervyn's passion for his cattle astounded many, he was a man full of knowledge, well and truly wise beyond his years. He always strived for success whether it be in the show ring with his Bazadais or the sale ring with his Simmentals. He was a skilled cattleman with a tremendous eye for cattle and an even greater ability to find influential genetics and invest in them no matter what the cost. He was so proud of his Simmental herd and it showed when he presented his bulls for sale. He never did anything by halves and certainly had the gift of the gab when it came time to sell them.

The number 13 all though unlucky for some, proved to be nothing short of lucky for him when it came to the Simmental sale ring. Merv would be on the phone days prior to an upcoming sale securing his number 13 bid card. It was one of his quirky traits that made him who he was, an inspirational man and a true gentleman.

Mervyn married Courtney in 2014 and although it wasn't the fairy-tale ending they had hoped for, there was still eight years of creating a life together that has blessed them with so many precious memories. Mervyn and Courtney raised two beautiful boys together and continued to once they went their separate ways. They had their differences but in the end they did what was best for their children, joined forces and nailed co-parenting. He always had the exceptional quality of making sure the boys came first, making the absolute best out of any situation. He was such a devoted and loving father to, not only Mason, but also Xavier, from the moment they came into his life.

Mervyn's two greatest achievements in life were his cattle and his kids.

Mervyn was taken from us far too soon on the 19th of March, a tragic conclusion to such a promising life.

He touched so many people's hearts and will leave his mark on all who knew him. Mervyn you are so deeply loved and so sorely missed.

GRANT RICHARD JACKSON



Grant "Jacko" JACKSON devoted most of his adult life to agriculture, in particular the beef cattle industry. He was a stalwart in the early days of Simmental in Australia and his contribution to the breed has been significant.

Jacko was educated at Prince Alfred College in Adelaide and left school at the tender age of 15 years. He immediately commenced work as a jackeroo and worked on a number of properties for the Scottish Australia Company, rising to the position of overseer within a short period of time. In his early 20's he took a position with Munduney Pastoral Company, a large cropping, sheep and stud shorthorn enterprise in the mid-north of South Australia, and it was there that he formed a lifelong love and appreciation of stud cattle.

Jacko's contribution to Simmental Cattle in Australia commenced when he took on the position of manager at Ian and Jan Gray's Piggott Range Simmental Stud at Clarendon SA in 1975, a position he held until 1982.



Following the dispersal of the Grimich Park stud, Jacko managed Woodnook Simmentals at Nagambie in Victoria and consulted for a number of clients. It was during this period of his life that he formed an enduring relationship with Stephen Stone, "Lion Rural"; ultimately managing his rural enterprises on Kangaroo Island, Queensland and the southeast of South Australia.

Sadly, Jacko suffered a stroke in 2012 and was forced to leave the workforce on a fulltime basis. This did not stop Jacko from keeping an 'iron in the fire'. He continued to work for the Hurst family at Robe S.A. on a casual basis right up until his illness prevented him from doing so.

In the last years of his life Jacko was a feature at a number of led steer/carcase competitions and his passion for showing cattle and striving for excellence never waned. He really appreciated good animals.

Jacko was a 'scallywag'. He was sometimes loud and rambunctious. He had great 'eye' for cattle and an inimitable charm with young people; he would ask questions of a young person and be genuinely interested in their answer. Young people loved his company. Simmental breeders, particularly those in South Australia, will miss Jacko in the cattle barns at future shows.

Jacko passed away peacefully on the 13/4/2019 after a short illness. He is survived by his wife, Pauline, his two children Sophie and Hamish and his four grandsons.




Aroha Eduard was imported from New Zealand in 1976 and shown at the Adelaide Royal two months later and was the first Simmental

to be exhibited at a Royal Show in Australia. He was 11 months old and attracted much media attention including a Swiss miss, traditional cow bells from the alps and lots of mumbling and curious sideways looks from the traditional beef breeders! 

GINA'S LIFELONG DEDICATION TO SIMMENTALS RECOGNISED

"HARD work" is synonymous with the name Gina Ryan in Australia's Simmental industry.

And that hard work paid off once again when Gina was awarded Life Membership of Simmental Australia at the Melbourne Show on September 28.

Gina was so busy on her farm at Glenburn in Victoria that she wasn't even planning to attend the show and only agreed to go after two of her friends who were in on the surprise offered to pick her up and drive her down to it.

"I never suspected a thing, even when I heard them [the presenters] talking about Alan Jones, I didn't realise and then I heard my name," she said.

"I was shaking, I got a surprise, and the first thing I thought was that my mother and my husband aren't here to share it with me.

"I had tears in my eyes, I thought my husband isn't here and then I realised that he was up there in Heaven with my mum and they were both looking down on me."

Gina and her husband Mel established Glenview Del Simmentals at Glenburn after running race car driver Alan Jones's farm and Miraleste [Simmental] stud in the 1980s.

"Mel and I were both from farming backgrounds, but when I was a child we had to sell our family farm and move to Melbourne for Dad's health," she said

"It just broke my heart."

"My mother used to say that I always had the farm in the back of my mind, but when I finished school, she told me I had to pick a job whether it was a secretary or a dressmaker, so I became a hairdresser and got my start."

After Gina qualified as a hairdresser, she set up a salon in the Melbourne suburb of Box Hill and while Mel was managing the farm, she would drive over an hour from Glenburn to Box Hill.

With five children and a farm of their own, it was a juggling act but that was something which came easily to the Ryans.

"I used to drop the kids off to the neighbours before I left and they would get the bus from there, it was a long day, but I just loved it [hairdressing] and all my clients," Gina said.

"I used to go and help Mel on both the farms on the weekends and Mel used to tell me that he needed me out on the farm, but I was involved in my salon."

In 1986 Alan sold his farm and the buyer approached Gina offering to match what she made through her hairdressing business if she came and worked on the farm, so after 25 years she shut the doors of the shop.

Mel was into the breeding and selection side of the business and then Gina broke the cattle in and showed them.

"Perfectionism was something we strove for, we had our own place and we got more into showing," Gina said.

By 1990 Gina and Mel were working for Penbro Park stud and they were the most successful at Melbourne Show out of 200 other competitors.

It was the biggest showing of Simmentals in Australia at that time.

"So Mel decided while the stud was at the top of its game, that that was the time to disperse it.

"The owners dispersed Penbro in 1994 and went commercial and I stayed on there for 12 months afterwards and then I thought 'Well I want to do my own thing'.

"We had about 40 breeders, we'd bought five females from Penbro Park as that was all we could afford at that stage, so we bought a Simmental bull from South Australia and one from Greta in North East Victoria to put over them.

"We also AI-ed a lot of our females and this was the beginning of Glenview Del Simmentals.

"Some of our genetics probably go back a 100 years or more, Mel sourced them back and they go back a long way."

At the same time, Gina and Mel were still working for other commercial operations, selecting Angus cattle and putting Glenview Del bulls over

good jobs so we had to prove ourselves," she said.

"He believed that every breed of cattle has their best and has their worst."

"The farms that we worked for didn't lose out on the breeding; we had

Mel was president of the Victorian Simmental Society and also went on to serve on Simmental Australia's Federal Council before exhibiting at the Simmental World Congress when it came to Melbourne in 2010.

In 2007 the Royal Agricultural Show Society of Victoria (RASV) also awarded him the RASV President's Medal for his services to both the cattle industry and the wider agricultural show movement.

When Mel passed away in 2011, Gina wanted to keep on going to honour his legacy.

"I just loved what I did and it was a way to remember him, but before he died, Mel said that he didn't want me doing all this work by myself so I did cut back and stop doing so much work for other studs and farmers."

But work was second nature to Gina and she hasn't really slowed down that much.

"I don't think I'm a workaholic, I just love what I do," she explained.


"I like the challenge of it and proving to myself that I can do it – some of the cattle I've broken in were so hard, the hardest one took six months but when we got him to Melbourne he won there.

"I never hurry anything, nothing worries me and I just go with the flow.

"I still do a lot of older peoples' hair at home, the ones who can't leave home, but I'm blessed with good health and I've always had to work so I think I'm lucky I can keep on doing it.

"I hope I can keep on going like this for as long as I can."

Which seems a fitting attitude for a woman who has just been recognised for dedicating the best part of her life to the Simmental breed.



Q FEVER VACCINE FUNDING BECOMES ANOTHER POLITICAL FOOTBALL

AUSTRALIAN scientists are seeking \$500,000 funding to complete guinea pig trials on an improved Q Fever vaccination which could cut the current requirement of two doctors visits exactly seven days apart down to just one visit and allow children under 15 to access vaccination, but so far their pleas have virtually fallen on deaf ears.

Q Fever is an airborne infection caused by the bacteria Coxiella burnetii which is usually transmitted through direct or indirect contact with animals.

Queensland and NSW are Australia's Q Fever hotspots, with the drought increasing the number of cases due to dustier and winder conditions.

While someone can be infected with Q Fever without showing outward symptoms, those who do have symptoms appear as if they are suffering from a severe flu.

Their symptoms include high fevers and chills, sweats, severe headaches, muscle and joint pain, diarrhoea, abdominal pain and high levels of lethargy and fatigue.

The more serious cases can go on to develop hepatitis, pneumonia, ongoing chronic infections involving heart valves and arteries as well as a post-Q fever chronic fatique syndrome.

While only 1 percent of people diagnosed with acute Q Fever will die from it, over 30 percent die if they develop chronic Q fever.

Graziers, stud breeders and dairy farmers are most at risk of contracting the disease, but anyone working in the livestock industry or coming into contact with cattle, sheep, goats and kangaroos and even domestic animals such dogs and cats is also susceptible.

This includes livestock agents and workers, animal transport workers, vets and vet nurses, abattoir workers, animal shooters and shearers.

Australia is the only country in the world to currently vaccinate humans against Q Fever.

The Q-VAX was developed by an Australian team headed up by microbiologist and academic Barrie Marmion (now deceased) and was approved for use by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) in 1989.

It is estimated to be about 95 percent effective in preventing vaccinated people from contracting Q Fever.

People who have previously had Q Fever cannot be vaccinated in case they have a bad reaction to the vaccine, due to already being immune to Q fever. However three decades after Q-VAX's release, and despite its obvious benefits, there are a lot of at risk people who still remain unvaccinated.

This is attributed to people either not being aware that they can be vaccinated against Q Fever or not having the time or financial resources to access the vaccine.

Doctor Stephen Graves is a medical doctor, a Professor of Microbiology and the Medical Director at Australian Rickettsial Reference Laboratory in Geelong, Victoria.

HE ATTRIBUTES THE LARGE NUMBER OF AT RISK PEOPLE WHO REMAIN UNVACCINATED TO THREE REASONS:

- TIME: The need for a blood and a skin test to be carried out to see if a
 patient has been infected by Q Fever already and pending the results
 of these tests, a second trip to the doctor exactly seven days later to
 receive the vaccination.
- COST: The Q-VAX is not listed on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) and is costlier than many other vaccines.
- The vaccine is not recommended for children under 15 years old despite many graziers' children being expected to help with livestock work such as feeding from an early age, especially during times of drought.

Dr Graves' team is working on a new version of the vaccine which would eliminate the need for two visits to the doctor to get the vaccination and also make it available to children under the age of 15.


"The microorganism (Coxiella burnetiid) is a bacterial cell and the old vaccine (Q-VAX) is what is known as a whole cell vaccines so it contains all the bacterial molecules, whereas our new vaccine only contains that part of the bacterial cell which is important for immunity; this is known as a subunit vaccine," Dr Graves said.

"This new vaccine would eliminate the need for skin and blood tests meaning that you could just get the vaccination on your first visit without having to go back a week later.

"It won't be the palaver that it is at the moment and it will be really, really easy for doctors to administer which makes will make it more accessible for patients.

"Q-VAX was originally not tested on children under 15 so when it was registered, it was not able to be offered to patients younger than this, except in extenuating circumstances.

"In the scenario that a farmer's herd is infected with Q Fever and he wants his family vaccinated to protect them, a doctor can administer Q-VAX to a child under 15 but this is known as an "off label" use and can only be done in extenuating circumstances.

"We are in fairly early stages with animal testing for the vaccine, but it looks promising and we desperately need more money."

Dr Graves has approached the Federal Government and NSW state governments for funding.

The NSW Government Health Department provided \$200,000 of funding in 2018 but with a scientist costing approximately \$100,000 to employ annually, these funds have already been used.

"We are very grateful for NSW's contribution, but we still need \$500,000 to further work on animal trials so that we can prove it is safe for later phase 1 human trials," Dr Graves said.

In late August a rural group including the NSW Farmers' Association, Australian Meat Industry Council, Country Women's Association of NSW, National Farmers' Federation, Australian Livestock and Rural Transporters Association, the Australian Meat Processor Corporation and Q fever researchers lobbied Federal politicians who are responsible for health and rural Australia to provide funding for Q Fever education and vaccine research.

The letter said that the NSW Government was the only administration to provide any funding to date and that the Federal government continued to refer requests for assistance to state governments.

The Federal Government has been deafeningly silent on this issue despite recent increases to drought funding in late September.

This funding was announced around the same time that it was revealed previous drought funding has been used by councils for regular council works such as road maintenance and public toilet installations or one off events like music festivals and sporting events which have few positive long term benefits for rural communities.

Ian Staines is a south western Queensland based cattle grazier who has also served on local government for three terms and is well versed in the intricacies of government funding.

lan's mother, son and nephew have all had Q Fever, with his son suffering the most.

"We took him to two doctors on the Gold Coast without getting any answers and it was only the third doctor in Toowoomba who correctly diagnosed him with Q Fever and hospitalised for a few davs," he said.

"It would seem to me that vaccinations and encouraging the uptake of them would be the best bang for the buck in medical spending and I can't understand why our federal and state politicians won't commitment to this advancement in rural health.

"It's particularly frustrating given the government expects us to have biosecurity plans in place and one of the things which comes under a biosecurity plan is having at risk people vaccinated for Q Fever."

A NSW Health spokesperson said that from 2018-2022, the NSW Government is spending \$1,000,000 on Q Fever awareness campaigns and GP education.

"A remote learning module for general practitioners and other primary care providers has been developed in a partnership between NSW Health and the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine," the spokesperson said.

NSW based GPs are eligible to complete this course free of charge.

A Queensland Health spokesperson would only say that the department would continue to monitor the progress of the improved Q Fever vaccination research.

A spokesperson for Minister for Regional Services, Decentralisation and Local Government Mark Coulton said the Federal Government provides funding to the Q-VAX manufacturer Segirus which makes the vaccine's production commercially viable.

"A vaccine cannot be subsidised under the

Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) or the National Immunisation Program until it is assessed by the Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee (PBAC) and meets robust cost-effectiveness criteria," the spokesperson said.

"To date, Seqirus has not made a submission to the PBAC for Q fever vaccine."

The Minister for Agriculture Senator Bridget McKenzie, the Minister for Health Greg Hunt, and the Minister for Water Resources, Drought, Rural Finance, Natural Disaster and Emergency Management David Littleproud all failed to respond to requests for comment made three business days in advance with Minister McKenzie's office simply refering the questions to the Health department more than six hours after deadline.

SIMMENTAL STUDS OPEN GATES FOR

Simmental studs throughout Victoria have taken part in an on-farm challenge showcasing some of the best bulls, cows and calves in the breed.

The second Simmental Victorian On-Farm Challenge had 18 studs register to be apart of the competition, as about 200 head of cattle were judged.

Properties as far west as Edenhope and as far south as Bunyip in Gippsland took part in the challenge.

Simmental Victoria secretary/treasurer Garry Gillett said the idea behind the event was to take the "judge to the people".

"We want to give members a chance to meet other members and the chance to be judged on farm without going to the expense of preparing animals for a show," he said.

"We're judging them on their paddock condition so if they're a bit dirty, it doesn't matter and considering the drought around Victoria, this challenge has been extremely successful."

Cattle were judged on their age and awarded a score out of 10 in 10 different categories with winners to be announced at a special luncheon later in the year.

Simmental Victorian On-Farm Challenge judge Kathy Eden, Glen Forbes, who has previously judged cattle at Royal agricultural shows throughout Australia, said many cattle were hard to fault.

"Up through Wangaratta, Echuca and so on to me - I'm from South Gippsland - the conditions look dreadful but they are all very positive, very upbeat and just waiting on autumn which is incredible," Mrs Eden said.

"It's going to be a nightmare sorting the judging out because with the exception of 10 out of the 200 we've seen, I don't know how I'll split some of them."

Mrs Eden said "muscle and capacity" had been a theme throughout the event.

"When I first started judging the cows had a longer, flatter muscle type and were a finer type of animal - they were probably a bit harder doing than what they are now," she said.

"Simmentals are much heavier cattle now which is really good because you put vealers in the pens and that's exactly what you want but they can all still milk which is a big positive too."

GIVING IT A CRACK

Rory Templeton, 20, started his Merton Rush Simmental stud operation a year ago and said it was an "awesome opportunity" to be judged and critiqued on his cattle.

"We started the stud operation as a bit of a diversification project to supplement the milking dairy side of the business," Mr Templeton said.

Mr Templeton, along with his father, Greg, milk 170 Simmentals and supply their product to Ferraro Cheese in Tullamarine.

The stud operation consists of eight stud cows, including five with calves at foot, and a nine-month-old bull by Woonallee Jetstream.

"Money has been our biggest challenge because we source all our genetics from South Australia ... but we've been able to buy nice cows for reasonable prices," he said.

"We want to slowly build the numbers and focus on having the quality over quantity."

'WET AND SLUSHY' AT NAR NAR GOON

Up the road at Mt Ararat Simmentals, stud principal John Leek has been forced to truck cattle off his Nar Nar Goon property due to high rainfall.

He said his property, near Pakenham, had received more than 500 millimetres of rain in the four months ending October.

He started the stud operation 12 years ago with a herd of pure-bred cattle from Tom Baker at Woonalee Simmentals in SA and now has 70 breeding females.

"This challenge is a great idea because we have people like Kathy [Eden] come out and tell us where we're at with our cattle because we look at them everyday and get carried away with out own cattle sometimes," Mr Leek said.

"I'm doing my best everyday to improve them, you have to be on your ball all the time, and I'm getting my genetics from Buzzard Hollow in Texas; semen, embryos and then buying the best bulls and females we can."

Mr Leek said he was shifting his stud focus following the purchase of a \$15,000 bull from Woonalee this year.

"He's homo polled ... I'm going work on breeding homo polled bulls because I think that's the future around here," he said.

"It's a genetic that you test for and if you bred him to 100 head of cattle, you'll probably get 98 with no horns."



ON-FARM CHALLENGE

'LEVEL PLAYING FIELD' SAYS JUDGE

Cattle in the on-farm challenge were judged on a score sheet, removing personal opinion by a judge "to a certain extent" Mrs Eden said.

"We're looking at muscle particularly for the bulls, for example muscle type and capacity of body and the way they cover the ground and how they walk," she said.

"I'm very big on heads and eyes, other judges may place less of a focus on that, and I'm pretty big on hip-to-pin and in cows udders and udder placement is important."

Mrs Eden said the event provided a cheaper alternative for breeders to show their cattle on-farm.

"It justifies for some people some of the decisions they've made and clarifies in their minds that they are getting the result they want," she said.

The results from the On Farm Challenge will be announced at a lunch on Sunday 1st December with results publish on the Simmental Australia website.

EARLY START IN STUD WORLD FOR BRODHI

Brodhi Carracher is only 24, but he already has a stud of about 100 breeders and is getting ready to start his first position as a graduate vet.

Mr Carracher started Grangeburn Simmentals, based at Wannon, Vic, as an 18-year-old in 2013, with genetics from Woonallee, Wormbete and Valley Creek studs.

"I've imported some embryos from Canada this year, so I'll have about 20 recipients, 80 Simmental cows and about 20 SimAngus," he said.

Mr Carracher has been at university in Adelaide for the past six years, but having a job at Warnambool brings him closer to the herd, which is run alongside his parents' 150-head commercial operation with Angus and SimAngus cattle.

"I went to a few Simmental sales and I liked the powerful cattle with a lot of muscle," Mr Carracher said.

"I like Herefords for fat cover and Charolais for muscle, but the Simmentals had the maternal ability with heaps of milk, great fat cover for a European breed, and the growth I was looking for."

When the stud began Mr Carracher used mostly Australian bloodlines but he now sources genetics from JB Livestock in Canada.

He currently sells about 10 bulls a year, but hopes to increase that and eventually have an on property sale.

"I needed to find some different bloodlines, outcross genetics that will still suit Australian cattle," he said.

"I flushed six donors from over there and those calves are being born in April."

IN CHELSEA'S BLOOD

Chelsea Rayner's passion for Simmental cattle runs in her blood.

The 22-year-old is on a small block near Beulah in north west Tasmania, running Simmental and Shorthorn cattle.

Miss Rayner established her Kidman Downs stud, which has about 25 head, in 2013 and her sister Sarah started the Shorthorn stud in 2015.

"My grandfather, father and uncle had always used Simmental bulls so when I started showing through the school program I was drawn to them, and my family has been incredibly supportive with the studs."

Miss Rayner's goal is to increase stud numbers, but it's difficult to find the space for more cattle.

"We have 56 acres (23 hectares) on my father's property, and it's hard to find country in Tasmania. It's highly productive country but there's not quite enough to expand."

She also hopes to become a livestock agent, focusing on seedstock. At the moment she also works part-time at Royston Shorthorns, doing general farm work and show preparation.

Miss Rayner shows regularly, and is starting to get some experience as a judge.

"I was associate judge with Robert Hutchinson for the Red Angus and Simmental national sale at Dubbo and it was such an eye opener to judge there," she said.

"It can be hard, being from Tasmania, to get those opportunities on the mainland."



ONE of Shirley Barker's earliest memories is leading a calf from a stud dairy at Mount Compass at the Adelaide Show, so it was fitting that she was there when Mount Compass Area School student Courtney Holbourn placed third in the Novice Led Steer competition with a steer from Shirley's Bokara Simmental stud.

After a childhood on the land, Shirley and her husband Victor O'Grady were some of the first Australians to breed Simmentals.

They established Bokara at "Caithness" near Mount Barker in the Adelaide Hills in 1972.

"We were interested in crossbreeding, my husband had done a lot of genetic work and I also had an understanding of genetics," Shirley said.

"We knew hybrid vigour would get us more money for our calves and European breeds like Simmentals offered more muscle and the Simmental also offered a lot more milk. Casterton [Western Victoria], we topped the sales and we laughed all the way to the bank."

Nearly five decades on, Shirley's reputation in the cattle industry has gone from strength to strength after the success of both Bokara Simmentals and her Caithness stud which breeds Charolais.

So when Courtney approached her ag teacher, Kiara Edwards, about selecting a Simmental steer to train, study and compete with in the Adelaide Show as part of her Year 12 Agriculture Studies, Shirley was one of the first names that came to mind

"I knew of Shirley through the show circuit, she has a beautiful reputation so I put Courtney in touch with her," Kiara said.

"The ag students 'really own the whole competition', they take the training over.

"They have had experience with cattle before but in year 12 they choose what breed they want and they put forward a training plan about what the

> steer is going to do, how it's going to react and how they are going to overcome challenges."

"I initiate contact with the stud owners then I step back and it's up to the kids to keep in touch."

Courtney wanted a Simmental to increase her cross breed knowledge.

"I had shown steers for three years and researched a lot of breeds, but we'd never had a Simmental so I wanted to see what the difference was in terms of temperament and the results when he was cut up," she said. The result was Shirley donating Albie.

Over the months, Courtney and Albie

developed a bond which Kiara said was testament to the hours spent together.

"Courtney put in a beautiful amount of work with Albie, he was a very big animal, but she was more than confident handling him," she said.

"She tracked his weight, but he was having trouble feeding and after Courtney looked into it, she realised that he wasn't taking to the feeder, so she bucketfed him and once she started this, he was a dream to feed.

"But the thing that really stood out straight away aside from his feeding ability was his temperament, he was just so easy to work with." Courtney agreed.

"Behavioural wise he was pretty good, we formed a great bond as he was very mellow compared to a Murray Grey or an Angus."

Courtney's work paid off when she took Albie to the Adelaide Show where she placed third out of 19 competitors in the Novice Led Steer Competition in September.

Unfortunately the results of the carcass competition weren't as favourable with Albie cutting dark and scoring 5.77 on the pH.

Kiara and Courtney put this down to a combination of factors including the sheer amount of people Albie was exposed to in his time at the show and his gentle nature which meant people were interacting with him all this time

"He was 712kgs live weight at just over 12 months, his EMA was quite good being 115 and his yield was 35/35, so hadn't he cut dark he would have been up there with the best of them," Kiara said.

Ten percent of Australian beef cuts dark with exposure to large amounts of people and animal stress prior to slaughter being two of the biggest causes of this.

Results aside, Kiara said the take home for students was the ability to engage with industry and train an animal they can be proud of, whether it presents the best on the day or not.

"They need advice aside from me; lots of kids struggle to talk to people in the industry, but once they have something in common with the breeder, that passion, it's great to see them interacting with them," she said.

Courtney agreed saying both the practical skills and the communication skills she's built through her studies have given her a better understanding as she looks to forge a career in agriculture after school

"It's given me more knowledge and taught me about what things you can track and how you can change them," she said.

"If I was looking to show again, I'd definitely go with a Simmental, but if I was using Simmentals in a breeding operation, I'd probably cross them with an early maturing breed to access the weaner market.

And what does Shirley get out of donating her cattle?

"Number one, I get the joy of seeing kids empathise with cattle where a lot of them wouldn't otherwise get an opportunity to be that responsible for an animal," she said.

"The youth are the future of cattle so we want to give them something that is really gentle and loving so they bond with them and have a positive experience.

"This engenders empathy and interest and affection and then they (the students) all fall in love with him and pat him like a dog; it's really ridiculous to see the animal lying down and the kids lying down asleep with it.

"It's just a very good thing for everyone: it's good for the school, it's good for me and it's great for the future of our breed."



"They say that if it's big and muscly, it can't milk, but that's not true.

"When we went overseas, we were amazed at the power of the cows and their milking ability." Shirley and Victor put the Simmental bulls over the 10 breeds they were running which include Angus, Herefords, Jerseys, Murray Greys and Shorthorns.

They were also involved in an AI operation with the Struan Research Centre where the then Department of Agriculture imported the semen which Shirley and Victor used to AI their cows, with the department keeping the bull calves and Shirley and Victor retaining the females.

Shirley admits they copped criticism for crossbreeding at a time when most breeders were focused on purebreds.

"We were known as the 100s and 1000s because we had all colours and everyone was very critical of us because in those days to not have purebred was a disgrace, but at the weaner sales in

SIMMENTAL SIRED STEERS SOAR TO THE NEXT LEVEL IN THE UNISCHOOLS STEER CHALLENGE

INTRODUCING a Simmental bull into the Poll Hereford steer breeding program for the Unischools Steer Challenge at Western Sydney University's Hawkesbury campus in 2015 has resulted in an overall higher quality carcase in the steers bred since then.

The female progeny is retained and kept as future breeders to improve the cow herd.

The annual challenge, which is in its 19th year, involved more than 90 Year 7 to Year 12 students from 11 high schools learning how to raise and handle an animal from different perspectives ranging from nutrition to grooming, parading and judging over 100 days

Senior students were also able to learn more about what factors influence meat quality, conduct a taste test and see the boning out of the steer's carcass.

The carcasses are then sold to the farm's local meat wholesaler.

Western Sydney University's farm production coordinator Joe Kovacek said this challenge is about "taking it [the production process] that step further than paddock to plate; we are taking it from conception to plate".

"They [the steers] are bred, killed and eaten within a 40km radius of the Sydney Basin, so the students can buy the meat, see how it tastes and what things have influenced this.

"We need to get our youth and consumers on board to help increase our beef industry's profile as it is one of the best and cleanest in the world." When Joe joined WSU as farm production coordinator, he was given a clean slate to take the livestock program in whatever direction he chose. With a background in livestock production and having worked throughout the Hawkesbury region, Joe's priorities were maternal traits, temperament and being able to trace a sire's

"I was chasing a bull that had a moderate birth weight to suit small framed poll Hereford cattle, good eye and skin pigment, soft skinned short coated polled and I wanted ease of calving as well as an increase in milk," we want vealer producers "he explained.

"Limousins tend to reduce milk yield rather than increase it and Charolais can have calving problems so I arrived at the Simmental."

Joe sourced a bull from Valley Creek Simmentals in Bowral to put over the Poll Hereford females to produce Simmental Poll Hereford cross steers and heifers.

While the best of these steers are used in the Challenge, Joe has since Aled some of the heifers with Akaushi genetics to see if the three breeds combined will step up the carcass and eating quality.

A Japanese breed, the Akaushi are known for faster marbling, meaning the cattle place fat inside the muscle instead of on the outside which means less waste.

But before the steers can be handed over to the students, some who might be complete novices to caring for an animal of that size, they need to be broken in.

Alana Wade has just finished her final exams for her Bachelor of Animal Science (Natural Science) at WSU and alongside WSU Farm staff, she broke in 15 steers earlier this year to produce a draft of 12 which were suitable for the students to work with.

Having participated in the challenge when the steer was a purebred Poll Hereford, Alana believes the Simmental Poll Hereford cross steers are superior to the purebred.

"There's been a definite improvement in their muscling and the Simmental has a nice temperament which is good to work with," she said.

Originally from a cut flower farm, Alana credits participating in the challenge along with being part of her high schools showing team as being some of the early things which got her interested in livestock as a career.

In 2018 she established her Simmental stud, Serenity Cattle Co, with Ausbred Red Bambi II, purchased from Ausbred Genetics at Kurmond. Red Bambi was awarded second in the 19-10-months Simmental class at Sydney Royal in April.

Alana led Red Bambi with Red Simmental semen from Canada with her first calf Serenity Queen Bambi born in late August.

"I've always been fond of the rich red colour along with black and will be exploring Simmental bulls that I believe would be ideal for this cow as I am fond of the maternal attributes of the Simmental breed," she said.

"I really like the different elements that Simmentals add to the beef industry; they improve eye muscle area, growth and performance and I have found they train well and I enjoy their personalities."

But has all the attention to detail and the pursuit for hybrid vigour paid off when it comes to what the average consumer is prepared to pay for? Second generation butcher Ray Shipley of George's Fine Meats in Cherrybrook believes the beef speaks for itself.

"We bought one of the challenge steers and the meat was undoubtedly very, very good," he said.

"It proved that properly raised Simmental cross bred beef which eats incredibly well can be very affordable compared to the expensive branded beef programs.

"I've told Joe that when he has more beasts that size and age, we will definitely be buying again." Ray believes that the introduction of social media and reality cooking shows has expanded peoples' taste buds to include things, which would have been foreign to their parents.

"People are looking for basic schnitzel Monday-Friday, but on the weekend they are wanting something a bit different," he said.

"This has caught butchers out a little because once upon a time, we just sold sausages and steak but now we are expected to know more about meat and the cuts.

"I toured the Uni farm with Joe and Alex and we were talking about steers and heifers, but like so many other butchers, I had simply been calling it a cow.

"We as tradespeople need to become smarter because our customers are asking more questions wanting to know how the meat was produced and where it's come from.

"The Unischools steer challenge is helping to address this by exposing the current and the next generation of young people to the livestock industry while it's producing excellent quality meat."

The SA Junior Heifer Expo is a premier youth event held in South Australia, Adelaide annually. It is the largest and most successful industry educational event in Australia and is a platform for the youth within the beef industry to allow further development of their knowledge.

To enter, entrants have to be between 8 and 23 years inclusive as at 30.6.2019. Are not required to be a financial member of any Breed Society. May exhibit one heifer or steer only and the committee reserves the right to utilize any animal for the educational program.

All heifers competing in heifer classes must be registered with their relevant Breed Society. All live carcase entrants (steers & heifers) must state breed or percentages of breeds. Heifers eligible for entry must be born after 1.9.17 (Under 22 months). Animals must be fully weaned. Steers and heifers in the commercial live carcase competition must have milk teeth only and weigh over 280kg.

Animals to be judged on an interbreed basis, and divided into classes upon receipt of entries. Live carcase to be judged as animals on feed (to be slaughtered in approximately 40 days) and divided into classes upon weighing. Lastly, all exhibits must have an acceptable temperament and be broken to lead.

HANDLERS AGES as at 30/6 each year are put into the following age sections. Junior Section - 8 to 11 yrs; Sub-Intermediate - 12 to 14 yrs; Intermediate Section - 15 to 17 yrs; Senior Section - 18 to 23 yrs inclusive.

STICKING WITH SIMMENTALS AT BLACKALL

IAIN Adams is the fifth generation of his family to run Darracourt, a 70,000 acre holding 50 kilometres outside Blackall in Western Queensland.

He and his wife Dominique are continuing the legacy of Iain's father Ashley Adams with their Simmental Santa Gertrudis cross operation.

Ashley turned to Simmentals in the early to mid 2000s, building his numbers up by buying at Dr Richard White's Auscan dispersal sale in South Australia and he also bought from Brewers Simmentals.

"Dad was chasing the genetics of the cattle for tendaBEEF [Ashley's trademarked brand], he was very involved with GeneSTAR," Iain said.

"The GeneSTAR results of those cattle were all quite good and with a bit of cross breeding it didn't take much to improve them.

"I still have all the baseline genetics of the herd that dad ran for 15 years and I've maintained this genetic side of things but not quite as strictly as he did."

GeneSTAR is a DNA based diagnostic test for a collection of genes associated with marbling, tenderness and feed efficiency in beef cattle.

Cattle are joined all year round for ease of management with Iain preg testing every time they go through the yards.

Santa Gertrudis bulls are put over the maiden heifers and then a Simmental bull is put over them after that.

Iain has been sourcing his bulls from Meldon Park Simmentals on the Darling

Downs but has also bought from Blue Dog Simmentals at Wandoan in Queensland and Noanga Simmentals at Curlewis, NSW in recent years.

He selects bulls based off EBVs.

"I'm looking for big bones and soft skin to soften up the Santa Gertrudis side of our herd," he said.

"I like the result you get when you join them together.

"In terms of sourcing our Simmental bulls in the future, it really depends on supply.

"Once the drought breaks, we will rebuild our herd so if we run short and we can't get enough, we might go further down south to buy but I would like to stick with Meldon Park if I can as they supported me when I was doing the show circuit when I was at school.

"They're here and they have good cattle.

"We bought Meldon Park Niagra for \$12,000 at their annual sale in Moura in September.

"Niagra was runner up to the Grand Champion Simmental Bull at EKKA but I'm surprised he wasn't champion."

lain normally grows the cattle out to 400-450kg and sells them into the feedlot market as feeder steers through GDL at the Blackall saleyards.

A lack of feed forced him to sell earlier this year with weaner steers weighing between 200-220kgs making 340c/kg in July.









"We've had to buy a fair bit of hay from Victoria and also fed 100 tonnes of dry lick and rumen pellets just to keep our weaners afloat," lain said.

"Hay prices have been through the roof because there was no hay coming out of that Southern Queensland area around Dalby or Roma this year.

"I'm in the process of making a 400 acre farming paddock to grow some for ourselves so that we aren't as reliant on buying it in in the future."

The tougher season and feed prices mean that lain has dropped his herd back to 600, but he plans to rebuild to capacity of 2200 head once the season breaks.

"We just pulled 130 weaner heifers off so we will join all of them once things improve," he said.

"We use contract musterers but other than that, it's mainly been Dom and I doing things ourselves, she has been my number one for the last four or five years, but she's just had baby number two so she has her hands full at the moment!

"The Simmentals are well suited for out here, we are running them on the softer country and we put the other bulls out the back on the harder country and I'm pretty happy with the way they are turning out."

Chelsea was also a recipient of the Tasmanian Women in Agriculture and Tasmanian Alkaloids Marcus Oldham Rural Leadership Program, a week long intensive leadership program which focusses on teaching participants leadership qualities for themselves, as well as dealing with others in a professional manner. WEIGHT AND TEMPERAMENT DRIVE THE SWITCH TO SIMMY BULLS

Len "Tiger" Rodman and his son Shayne run two commercial cattle herds across 147 acres at Len's home block "Redbourne" and on Shayne's adjoining block near Ulverstone in northern Tasmania.

The Rodmans used to put Limousin bulls over Murray Greys to produce a crossbred vealer for a butcher, selling the butchery three or four beasts over the hooks a week.

When the butchery changed hands, they continued supplying the new owners but the closure of Devonport's abattoirs in 2018 forced them to change the way they operate.

"There was only a makeshift abattoir further away which increased our transport costs and I didn't like the way they ran their show," Len said.

"When our cattle went to Devonport [abattoirs], we would send them Wednesday and get a fax back Thursday morning with weights and everything on it, but we had to change the market we were aiming for after the abattoir shut down.

"We've now started putting Simmental bulls over our Murray Grey heifers and Angus cross Simmental heifers and are selling the progeny into the store market."

The cows and calves are cell grazed on grass with hay, silage and seconds potatoes from Len's other son Ricky's potato crops supplementing their diet.

The vealers are sold from between 9-to-10-months-old through Webb and Woodiwiss Livestock Marketing, Devonport on AuctionsPlus.

The move to AuctionsPlus in the last year has paid off with Len saying the saleyards just can't compete based on AuctionsPlus allowing you to list a reserve and the vendor not wearing the transport costs if the cattle don't sell.

"The only disadvantage is that sometimes the money is a bit slow coming in."

The switch away from Limousin to Simmental genetics was driven by a combination of factors including a lack of suitable Limousin bulls and the Simmentals' quieter nature.

"Our Limo went in the hock last year and he's had his day," Len said.

"But we can't replace him because studs are mainly breeding polled Limos now and you're very lucky if you can get a 100% purebred horned Limo bull.

"I like cattle that have been handled, all our Limos had been shown and were great but Limos are known to have a bad streak so we're looking for beasts that have been led."

Len bought Kidman Downs Nug from Chelsea Rayner of Kidman Downs Simmental and Shorthorns in April.

Len had been following Kidman Downs bulls since Kidman Downs Nug was crowned Champion of Champions Interbreed Beef Bull at the 2018 Royal Hobart Show.

"When I went up to Chelsea's, she showed me a few of the young ones and I was just really taken with them," Len said.

"When we got him on April 21, he was 723kgs and when he turned two on August 16, we weighed him and I got the shock of my life!



"He had grown to 874kgs over the winter months."

Nug will be joined to 14-month-old Angus-Simmental cross heifers in April and a Woonallee Simmental bull will also be put over the Rodman's 14-month-old Murray Grey heifers.

Len said the growth rate he has seen in Nug is one of the standout traits of the breed.

"We've always had good Limos, but the Simmy will weigh and grow heavier in the same growth period."





SIMBRAH STILL DELIVERING CONSISTENT RESULTS AT EIDSVOLD

KEVIN Preston's father first bought Simmental bulls over two decades ago and they're still performing just as well today.

"My dad first got Simmentals about 20 years ago and he was in partnership with my brother Richard and now it's Richard and I in partnership," Kevin said.

"It's a family operation with my wife Kylie and sons Riley (13) and Ryan (11) all chipping in.

"Our older son Jared also helps when he's not away working.

"We've never had a problem with the Simmental bulls, they [progeny] are often born pretty little but then they catch up really quickly.

"[Their] weight for age means they are very well received by buyers and you get paid per kilo so that's [good growth rates] obviously what we want.

"Their temperament is pretty good which is important because the boys want to help out with the cattle.

"They're doing the job for us and I'm happy to stick with what my dad taught me."

The Prestons usually buy their Simmentals bulls through Billa Park in between Dulacca and Jackson on the Western Darling Downs.

When selecting bulls, Kevin is going off EBVs, mainly considering the EMA.

"We want thick bulls with a bit of length," he

The bulls are put over Brahman females all year

round and graze on grass supplemented by Lucerne hay which Richard and Kevin grow on their 5000 acre aggregation outside of Eidsvold in Central Queensland.

The Brahmans give the short coat suited for the region.

At capacity the Prestons run 300 breeders, 120 steers and about 40 heifers for herd replacement, but after only receiving 8.5 inches of rain this year in contrast to their normal annual average of 24 inches, they've dropped back to 280 head.

The heifers are usually sold into the feedlot market at 8-10-months-old weighing 250-260kg through the Biggenden saleyards.

In May 2016, the Prestons's heifers won the Best Pen of Simmental or Simmental Infused Weaners at the Burnett Livestock and Realty All Breeds Weaner sale held at Biggenden saleyards.

They made 287c/kg topping at \$796 a head.

The majority of steers are sold at the Burnett Livestock All Breeds Steer Show and Sale in February at 18-months-old weighing around 400kgs.

The Prestons have won the Best Pen of Simmental or Simmental Infused Steers three out of the last four years.

In 2016 the steers sold for 326.2c/kg; in 2018 they made 287c/kg and in 2019 they sold for 290c/kg to top at \$1146.

In July their Simmental cross steers sold to 306.2c/kg to top at \$1555

and they also cracked 300c/kg for their four tooth bullocks at the Biggenden store sale on September 30.

"We were very happy with our 300c a kilo, you never expect that but it's great when it does happen," Kevin said.

"The market's kicked even more since then, the meatworks are going a bit harder."

While the dry season meant their hay production was down this year, Kevin and Richard still have enough feed for the foreseeable future.

"We're a lot better off than some other people; in a normal season we'd sell surplus hay which we don't have this year, but at least having it for ourselves is a help."







RECIPES

GAZZA'S SPICY SLOW COOKED BRISKET

SERVES: 6

TOTAL TIME: 10 hrs 30 mins

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE BARBECUE SAUCE

1 1/2 cups ketchup

1/2 cup packed dark brown sugar

1/2 cup water

1/4 cup finely chopped brown onion

3 tablespoons cider vinegar

3 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

2 chipotles in adobo sauce, finely chopped

(Or a few good glugs of a Chipotle sauce)

1 teaspoon garlic powder

3/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

FOR THE BRISKET

1/4 cup paprika

- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 1 tablespoon packed dark brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon kosher salt, plus more as needed
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, plus more as needed

1 (2 -2.5 kg) beef brisket, one piece not rolled.

Beefy brisket is transformed into tender morsels of barbecue goodness. Rub the beef with a combination of chili powder, cumin, brown sugar, cayenne, and garlic, then slow-cook it in a sweet-savoury sauce that includes smoky chipotle chillies. After 10 hours of gentle cooking, the meat can be sliced or shredded, tossed with the sauce, and stuffed into a sandwich or served on a bed of mashed potatoes with sweet potato fries & green beans.

METHOD

- Place all of the barbecue sauce ingredients in a 3-quart or larger slow cooker and stir to combine.
- Place all of the measured brisket ingredients except the brisket in a medium bowl and stir to combine.
- Place the brisket on a cutting board and cut it in half width wise. Evenly coat it with the spice rub and place the 2 brisket pieces in the slow cooker. Cover and cook on low until fork-tender, about 10 hours.

- Transfer the brisket to a clean cutting board.Pour the barbecue sauce from the slow cooker into a medium heatproof bowl and set it aside.
- 5. Remove the excess fat from the brisket and discard it. Slice the meat against the grain into 1/4-inch-thick pieces and return it to the slow cooker. (Alternatively, you can shred the meat with 2 forks.)
- 6. Use a spoon to skim and discard the fat from the surface of the barbecue sauce. Return the sauce to the slow cooker and stir gently to combine it with the meat. Taste and season with salt and pepper as needed.



LITTLE BEEF AND ONION POT PIES WITH MUSHY PEAS

SERVES: 6

PREP TIME: 20 mins COOKING TIME: 90 mins

INGREDIENTS

500g beef chuck steak, cut into small diced pieces Seasoned plain flour, for dusting (approx.. 1/4 cup)

- 2 onions, thinly sliced
- 1 clove garlic, finely chopped
- 2 cups (500 mL) beef stock
- 2 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tbsp finely chopped thyme
- 1 cup coarsely grated cheddar
- 2 sheets good quality store-bought shortcrust pastry

Lightly beaten egg, for brushing

MUSHY PEAS

300g frozen peas

3 mint sprigs

30g butter, diced

- 1 ½ tbsp pouring cream
- 2 tsp malt vinegar

METHOD

- 1. Heat 1 tbsp olive oil in large frying pan over medium-high heat. Dust beef in seasoned flour, shaking off excess and cook in the pan in 2 to 3 batches. Cook until well browned all over and set aside. Meanwhile, heat another tablespoon of olive oil in a saucepan, add onion and garlic and cook, stirring occasionally for about 7 minutes until onion is tender. Add the browned beef, stock, Worcestershire sauce and thyme, season to taste with salt and freshly ground pepper, reduce heat to medium and simmer gently, stirring occasionally for about 45 minutes until the beef is very tender. Cool to room temperature, then divide among six individual ovenproof bowls or ramekins (about 1 cup-capacity), refrigerate to cool completely, then scatter the tops of each with a little cheddar.
- 2. Preheat oven to 180°C. Cut out rounds from the pastry large enough to overhang the sides of your dishes by about 1cm. Brush edges with a little eggwash, then place over beef mixture, eggwash side down (the eggwash will help seal the pastry to the dish). Pierce or score a hole in the top of each pie, brush pastry with eggwash and bake until for about 15 minutes until pastry is golden brown.

3. Meanwhile, cook peas and mint in a saucepan of boiling salted water for about 2 minutes until tender, drain, discard mint and pulse in a small food processor with butter and cream to combine. Season to taste and just before serving stir though vinegar. Spoon on top of pies and serve.







ORANGE, HONEY AND MUSTARD OYSTER BLADE

SFRVFS: 4 PREP TIME: 10 mins COOKING TIME: 115 mins

INGREDIENTS

800g beef oyster blade steak, excess fat trimmed

1 tbsp olive oil

Zest and juice of 1 orange

1 tbsp honey

2 tbsp wholegrain mustard

1 cup (250ml) beef stock

400g can peeled tomatoes, lightly crushed

2 tbsp oregano leaves + extra, finely chopped,

Steamed baby chat potatoes, baby spinach leaves, cherry tomatoes, to serve

- 1. Preheat oven to 160°C (140°fan-forced). Heat oil in a large ovenproof casserole dish over medium-high heat. Add beef and cook for 2-3 minutes each side or until browned. Add orange zest and juice, honey, mustard, stock, tomatoes and oregano. Bring to the boil, cover with lid and place in oven. Cook for 1 1/2 - 1 3/4 hours or until beef is tender and falling apart. Season to taste.
- 1. Serve beef with sauce, potatoes, baby spinach, tomatoes and extra oregano.

SWEET CHILLI, SOY AND SESAME BEEF RIBS

MEAT & LIVESTOCK AUSTRA

SERVES: 4

PREP TIME: 60 mins COOKING TIME: 12 mins

INGREDIENTS

Beef short ribs (10 - 12) 1/2 cup sweet chilli sauce 1/4 cup tomato sauce 1/4 cup soy sauce

3 clove garlic, crushed

1 tbsp grated fresh ginger

2 tbsp sesame seeds, toasted



METHOD

- 1. Place the beef ribs in a large saucepan, cover ribs with water. Bring slowly to simmering point, over a low heat, simmer gently, partially covered for 1 hr.
- 2. Remove ribs from water, mix with combined chilli, tomato and soy sauces, garlic and ginger. Stand for 30 mins or marinate overnight.
- 3. Barbecue ribs over a moderate heat for 10-12 mins (see tips right), turning often and basting with any marinade until ribs are golden brown. Serve sprinkled with toasted sesame seeds.



STAR ANISE AND ORANGE GLAZED BEEF BLADE ROAST

SERVES: 6

PREP TIME: 30 mins COOKING TIME: 75 mins

INGREDIENTS

1.5kg blade roast, fat trimmed

5 whole star anise

2 oranges, zested, juiced, plus 1 extra thinly sliced orange

180ml (¾ cup) honey, warmed

2 tbsp olive oil

5 small sweet potatoes, cut into rough wedges

2 bunch baby choy sum, trimmed

3 bunch brocolini, trimmed

60ml (¼ cup) oyster sauce

1 tbsp toasted sesame seeds

2 stalks green onion, thinly sliced

METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C and line the base of a large shallow rectangular roasting pan with baking paper. Whisk together star anise, honey, orange juice and zest until combined. Line the base of the roasting pan with the extra sliced orange and place your beef blade roast on top and brush with orange mixture; season to taste. Roast, basting frequently, for 1 hour 15 minutes or until cooked to your liking. Rest, covered loosely with foil, for 20 minutes before carving, to serve. Place remaining basting mixture in a small saucepan over medium heat. Bring to the boil and simmer for 5 minutes or until reduced to a syrupy consistency. Set aside and keep warm until ready to use.
- 2. Meanwhile, place sweet potato in a separate large roasting pan with oil and toss well to combine; season to taste. Roast for 35 minutes or until golden and cooked.

- 3. Blanch baby choy sum and brocolini in boiling water until tender. Place in a large bowl with warmed oyster sauce and toss well to combine; season to taste.
- 4. Divide sweet potato, brocolini and baby choy sum among plates and scatter with sesame seeds and green onion. Carve beef a place on top, drizzle with orange and star anise glace.

A range of short 'how-to' videos to help beef and sheepmeat producers get started setting breeding objectives using breeding values in their herd or flock are part of the suite of genetics resources being rolled out by Meat & Livestock Australia (MLA).

The animated tutorials have been produced for temperate cattle, tropical cattle, Merino and prime lambs and are now available on MLA's new online genetics hub.

MLA General Manager – Producer Consultation and Adoption, Michael Crowley, said the release of the videos continues MLA's aim of providing clear, jargonfree resources to help commercial producers understand the benefits of genetic selection using breeding values within their production system.

"The videos take a step-by-step approach to explaining what breeding values are, how to set a breeding objective, what indexes are, and how to find sires on BREEDPLAN or Sheep Genetics," Mr Crowley said.


"They allow producers to understand genetic selection and get a handle on the basics before putting this new-found knowledge into practice at an upcoming bull or ram sale.

"Over recent weeks, MLA has been communicating the benefits of breeding values through producer case studies and 'Pick the Performer' ads.

"MLA is now promoting a range of resources to help producers get started with breeding values in order to support improving productivity."

MLA launched the genetics hub in June, providing a one-stop-shop of tools and resources aimed at demystifying genetics and breeding values to drive the productivity and profitability of commercial producers.

The hub is part of a broader approach being taken by MLA over coming months to inform producers about the role of genetics in achieving business productivity targets.

Using breeding values allow you to see 'under the hood' of an animal. You can see his weak points and his strengths to decide if he's the right fit for your herd.



CHANGES COMING TO MSA:

WHAT CATTLE PRODUCERS NEED TO KNOW

From June 2019, Meat Standards Australia (MSA) will be rolling out several changes to its model, the MSA Vendor Declaration Form and myMSA.

Some of the changes relevant to MSA-registered cattle producers include:

Hump height will be used as a direct predictor of eating quality: while hump height has always been measured as part of MSA, it will now be used as a direct predictor of eating quality rather than an estimate of tropical breed content.

A revised MSA Vendor Declaration form: the form will simplify how producers record tropical breed content and it will provide an option for owners who use agistment or custom feeding to receive direct carcase feedback through the myMSA feedback portal.

New myMSA features and look: producers will have access to an

Opportunity Index on cattle that did not meet minimum MSA grading requirements, giving producers an indication of the potential value of those carcases if they addressed the reasons for non-compliance. Users will also notice a refreshed, more user-friendly myMSA online portal.

In this presentation, MSA Producer Engagement Officer, Laura Garland, walks graziers through the changes and what they mean for MSA-registered cattle producers.



















BREEDPLAN PERCENTILE BANDS FOR SIMMENTAL

When BREEDPLAN results are reported online, in reports and in sale catalogues, they are typically presented in conjunction with breed average EBVs and selection indexes. While comparing an individual animal to the breed average allows producers to identify whether the animal is better or worse than the current genetic level of the breed for each trait and/or selection index, it does not allow producers to quantify how much better or worse the individual is. To do this, BREEDPLAN publishes percentile bands, which allows beef producers to rank animals from the Top 1% of the breed (1st percentile) down to the Bottom 1% of the breed (99th percentile).

PERCENTILE BANDS TABLE

To establish the rank of an individual within the breed for each trait or selection index, the user can take the individuals EBV and compare where it ranks on the Percentile Bands Table. For example, the following animal has a 200 Day Weight EBV of +28 kilograms.

The user can easily see that this animal is 9 kg better than the breed average (bottom line, +19) but to see where it ranks in the top half of the breed the user needs to go to the Percentile Bands Table. In the percentile bands table, a 200 Day Weight EBV of +28 kg places this animal in the top 10% of the breed (the cutoff for the top 10% in this example is 27 kg).

The Percentile Bands Table for the whole breed can be found on the last page of BREEDPLAN EBV reports and online at Simmental BREEDPLAN. For those users searching online, there are two options to access the whole breed percentiles:

- 1. In the EBV Enquiry Screen, click on the Percentiles link at the bottom of the page
- 2. In the Animal Details Screen for an individual animal, click on the Percentiles link within the EBV table






The 50th percentile value and breed average do not always match. The reason for this is that one is the mean (average value of the EBVs) and the other is the median (middle value if all animals are ranked from the highest to the lowest EBV).

PERCENTILE BAND GRAPH

The Percentile Band Graph provides cattle producers with a visual representation of how the EBVs of an individual animal rank in comparison to the rest of the breed. The Percentile Band Graph can be accessed via the Animal Details screen on the Simmental BREEDPLAN website, either scroll down to EBV table and click on the graph icon in the top right of the table, or click on the EBV graph link. This will open the Percentile Band Graph for the animal the user was looking at.




On the Percentile Band graph, the EBV traits and indexes are on the vertical axis and the percentile band is the horizontal axis. Thus a user can quickly get a feel for the strengths and weaknesses of individual animals, and to compare the attributes of different animals, by seeing what percentile band the individual animal is in for each trait and selection index.

It should also be noted that more favourable values are typically found on the right hand side of the graph (e.g. top 10% for 200 Day Weight EBV), but this is not always the case (e.g. Mature Cow Weight, Milk). The Percentile Band graph is also only available using the percentile bands of the whole breed so users seeking to utilise the sub type percentile bands will have to revert to the percentile band tables described earlier in this article.

PERCENTILE BANDS TABLE FOR BREED SUB TYPES

Unique to the Australian Simmental Breeders Association, there is also the provision to see how an animal ranks within Breed Sub Type (Black & Red Simmental, Sim Angus or Traditional Simmental). To access the breed sub type Percentile Bands Table, a user should go to the Animal Details screen for an individual and click on the percentiles details link above the EBV table. The Breed Sub Type Percentile Bands Table should be used in the same manner as the Whole Breed table described above.






SIMMENTAL GENETIC TREND INDEXES




SIMMENTAL GENETIC TREND CARCASS

DESCRIPTION OF COMPLETENESS OF PERFORMANCE STAR RATING

A CoP "star rating" is also calculated for each herd based on the proportion of calves within the herd born in a fixed 5 year period that have performance recorded for each trait. This star rating is available in the CoP report and, for some breeds, is also available on Internet Solutions. This provides bull buyers with an indication of how much performance has been submitted to BREEDPLAN by an individual seedstock herd when looking at the EBVs for their animals. Therefore if EBVs are an important part of their selection decision, then the star rating will enable buyers to easily identify herds that are recording complete performance information, and hence use the EBVs presented on the animals with confidence. For breeds that display the star rating, users also have the ability to limit animal. EBV, sale catalogue and member searches based on a minimum Completeness of Performance star rating criteria.



Herds with a star rating of "5" are gold standard. They are considered to be recording "complete" performance information with BREEDPLAN for all animals across all traits for which EBVs are available.



Herds with a star rating of "4" or "4.5" are silver standard. They are considered to be recording comprehensive performance information with BREEDPLAN for most animals and traits, but are recording less performance than a 5 star herd.



Herds with a star rating of "3" or "3.5" are considered bronze standard. They are considered to be recording performance information with BREEDPLAN for a reasonable number of traits or animals, but are recording less performance information than a 4 or 5 star herd.



Herds with a rating of "2.5" or less are recording information with BREEDPLAN but not for all animals or traits. They are recording less performance information than a 3, 4 or 5 star herd.

What is the value of the Completeness of Performance Report and Star Rating?

The CoP report and star rating allows each herd to assess how "complete" the information is for their animals and importantly to identify areas in which additional performance information could potentially be recorded. It is also an invaluable tool for detecting where data has not been submitted to BREEDPLAN. If made available, the CoP star rating can give you an indication of how much performance data other herds collect (but not which traits). This can be used to easily identify herds that are recording complete performance information, and thus be confident in the EBVs presented on their animals.

How to improve your CoP star rating

- 1. Work out which traits you aren't recording (and which are of interest to you or your clients)
- 2. Work out which traits you are recording but could record a greater percentage of animals for
- 3. Make the necessary management changes to enable you to record those traits





TOTAL SALE REVENUE 2001 – 2019








