### Executive Officer Report Carmel Mills

ear Members,
As I have settled into the role of Executive
Officer throughout this year it has been inspirational
to work with the Directors of the Board and in
particular the Executive team. The continual
contribution of so many voluntary hours in attending
to the many items that are involved in the operation
of the organisation and in dealing with the structural
changes required to move the organisation forward in
the changing and challenging business environment is
to be commended. The daily contact with members
has been both challenging and rewarding.

The challenges for the future of the cattle industry overall and particularly with the ongoing publicity around the issues of live exports and on farm feedlots has continued to highlight that Agriculture and the Cattle industry in particular is an industry of change. Australian farmers are some of the most productive producers in the world, working in the cleanest and greenest environments and we have a very valuable reputation to uphold. The increasing influence of social media and the viral nature of "news" with changes in consumer and animal welfare group practices is likely to continue to impact on primary production. It is increasingly important to keep the communication lines open between city and country. While the way we do things in farming is changing it is important to promote that our values and our commitment to caring for our animals and our environment remains the same. The many hours of work of our volunteers in keeping our social media presence current and relevant through our updated facebook page gives us an important presence in the social media arena.

The versatility of the Simmental breed and the different ways that our members and commercial breeders use Simmental has contributed to some lively debate about the role of our organisation and the future of the breed since I commenced. I am passionately committed to promoting Simmental as a commercially relevant and financially viable breed. However what this means in practice will depend largely on the target market and specifications being met by individual breeders. There will be some members passionately devoted to "traditional" cattle and others just as passionately advocating for a move to "black" or "red" or "Simbrah". Due to the versatility of the breed there are opportunities for financially sound expansion in any of these markets.



I do not see the role of the Association being to lead the breed exclusively into any of these areas to the detriment of any other, I believe it is our role to be inclusive of all breeders goals and aspirations for their herds. It is however our role to provide support and encouragement of good management practices and a "commercial and financially sound" focus of all of our members.

The challenges and opportunities that we look forward to include;

Proposed visit by members/delegates to China
Potential expansion of the Chinese market
Changes to industry through the changes to funding
from and focus of the MLA, including the possible
introduction of a multi-breed analysis tool
Uptake of on-line registration and potential for
streamlining administration processes
Review of the organisations by-laws

While some areas, particularly in Western QLD continue to struggle with drought and the slaughter rates across the cattle industry remaining at significantly high levels many breeders are reporting high prices and high clearance rates for their stud stock.

Whilst the focus of the organisation and the expenditure of our limited marketing funds will continue to be subject to lively debate we are calling on our members to promote our current marketing campaign and to all focus on and promote to the commercial cattleman the benefits of hybrid vigour provided by crossing with Simmental.

# Audrey Weightman

Just before migrating to Australia David and Audrey Weightman saw one of the first Simmental bulls imported into the U.K from Switzerland by their relations.

Once they were settled in the southwest of Western Australia they thought that the Simmental would be the ideal breed to produce the baby-beef/vealers for the WA market.

Having decided this they had a problem - no money. In the mid seventies Australia had the beef slump and cattle were only making fifty dollars each .

Working in the newly fledged vineyards seemed the only answer, so in rain hail and shine and sometimes thunderstorms they "labored in the vineyards "making vine cuttings in order to pay for their inseminations.

So far so good. When the steer calves were ready for market they attracted a 10 percent premium over the rest, so back to the vines it was.

In the late seventies it became obvious that a back up bull was needed after A.I. if we were going to keep our cattle calving in the correct season.

But the first two pure bred bulls were to be sold at Glen Innes, the other side of the country .

Imagine the audacity of this young couple who threw their children and a esky of cheap meat into their car and drove to Waterloo Grazing Co and bought a bull.

We bought the cheapest one but even then it cost the equivalent of eighty vealers. Many years later we purchased Woonallee Buddy for thirty thousand dollars but that was only forty vealers.

After two years that first bull Southern Eban broke down but by this stage there was a flush of bulls available in WA and we purchased Tenderloin Wellington for one thousand dollars. Wellington went on to work for us for over ten years working on our commercial cattle to produce F1's .Overall he produced over 640... yes "six hundred and forty" live



calves and at twelve years of age passed the Blockey test with two serves in three minutes and then he made us our thousand dollars back as he left.

We plugged away for many years just keeping the cattle we liked i.e. early maturing for this district easy calving easy fleshing long living fertile Simmentals and enjoying every moment of it. When we started to attend thee World Federations Congresses we really came to see the strength of our breed . We have seen Simmentals survive at minus forty degrees in Canada and plus forty degrees in Namibia. They are so adaptable as to produce meat with less than four mms of fat in Europe and above four mms in Australia. We ourselves have produced seven months old grass fed calves at 249 (two hundred and forty nine) kilos with six mm fat cover .

The many friends we have made over the years , both here and abroad have made us realize that we all belong to one huge Simmental family .

With the recent increase in prices (not before time) for our beef and the demand from Asia for our stud cattle the future looks hopeful and well worth the years of hard work.

S immental Member, Kristy Lawson from Beechboro, Western Australia is on her way to building her empire of Simmental stud cattle. Being the owner of "Precious Gem" Simmental stud, Kristy says "whilst attending Senior High School, I took an interest in cattle". Lockridge Senior High school is one of two schools in the metropolitan area that assist with Agricultural programs and whilst in year 11, the school purchased a steer from Topweight Grazing Co, to exhibit at the Perth Royal Show in 2003.

"I first met David and Audrey Weightman in 2003 and ended up completing work experience on the farm in 2004, which then led to working full time in the Margaret River region during 2005", Kristy said. "This is where I fell in love with the breed".

From here Kristy completed her Certificate 2 and 3 in Agriculture but, ended up coming back up to Perth

and has enjoyed show success from here, working alongside David and Audrey Weightman.

"I love the versatility of the Simmental breed", she says. After picking up a lease heifer in 2012, she has gone on to breed her first heifer calf, Precious Gem Jade. "I exhibited Jade at the 2014 Perth Royal Show and she won her class". Kristy then A.I.'d Jade to Woonallee Dimension and in 2015 she calved her first bull calf, Precious Gem Lawson who won the RAS Interbreed Calf Competition at the 2015 Royal Perth Show.

"I have another bull calf that is with my lease cow now but, this will be the last year I am leasing, as I recently purchased a heifer calf with Yarloop Simmental Genetics", Kristy said.

Since meeting her partner, Wade "Monty" Montague from Mundijong, Western Australia - the pair enjoy

showing cattle and with Wade's experience with Blonde D 'Aquitaine and Santa Gertrudis cattle, they are excited about the future breeding program of Precious Gem Simmentals.

When selecting animals for her stud, softness, good bone structure and temperament are Kristy's must-have criteria. "Simmentals are just simm-ply better beef", Kristy says - with this being her stud slogan. "Both Wade and I are looking at producing Simmental X Red Angus and Simmental X Hereford, in the future. "I have seen results from both of these cross bred animals and believe they complement each other for the commercial market". "Structural correctness is really important having such small numbers. We may be a small stud but plan on making an impact to the market".

Kristy will be keeping her stud numbers small, using bulls that work with her feminine females to produce animals that suit the current market. "I like the fact that I can walk into any paddock, knowing the animals temperament's, without any fear". "The females are maternal, have personality and produce high milk, which gives us bigger calves at weaning age", Kristy states. "I have three females, one proving this year she can produce what I am after".

Both Precious Gem Simmentals and Rural Ropes sponsored the 2015 Queensland Junior Camp and certainly, this "Precious Little Gem", is a big part of the Simmental future and would like to introduce more juniors, to the Simmental breed.

n recent years the demand from China for Simmental genetics has resulted in a very positive and encouraging new market for Simmental Australia members. The market involves the live export of high performance registered yearling sires, plus registered and commercial yearling breeding females. Pleasingly this trade has delivered outcomes that have been mutually beneficial to Australian and Chinese Simmental breeders. Australian Simmental breeders have been rewarded financially and in China, there has been substantial improvement in their Simmental herd. More importantly, strong international relationships have been established, right to the farm gate. Continued support for these relationships will undoubtedly deliver further gains in the performance of Simmental in both countries.

A significant number of young Australian bulls have found new homes in a number of artificial breeding centres in provinces throughout China, where they play an important role as AI sires. From these centres, which vary from being totally privately owned, to fully Government owned, semen is marketed to local producers. To be selected as sires, young bulls and their parents, particularly their dams, must meet a stringent selection criteria of high performance. Australian Group BREEDPLAN is used to identify these young sires and bulls with superior indexes are noticeably preferred. Also requested is the raw data for selected sires so that it can be used along with data from the many thousands of Simmental progeny, to build China's own Simmental genetic evaluation.

Simmental Australia members who have embraced BREEDPLAN and submit quality data have certainly benefitted from Chinese demand for high performance yearling bulls. While the numbers for each individual supplier may not be large, the opportunity to sell young bulls at very competitive prices has been most welcome. A number of Western Australian breeders with a strong performance focus, highlight the importance of

practising good data collection and submission to BREEDPLAN, with approximately 100 yearling bulls from W.A. selling to China in the last two years.

Spokesperson for live export company AUSTREX, Gary Legg, has been heavily involved in facilitating the market of yearling Simmental sires. Gary indicated that while numbers required in the future are hard to predict due to changes in policy from China's Ministry of Agriculture, he remains optimistic that the China market will continue to be a valuable opportunity for Australian Simmental members. Gary said that "the demand is still there for quality Simmental bulls......the Chinese love broken coloured, traditional animals and some Australian sires are top of the tree for CBI, China's Breeding Index.....and at the moment Simmental heifers are in high demand. "We have a planeload going in a few weeks".

Simmental Australia members can be optimistic about trade opportunities with China. To enhance our understanding of what Australian Simmentals are currently achieving in China and what is required from Simmental Australia to develop this market in the future, the Council has opted to send a trade mission to China in March 2016.

The relationships that are being developed have great potential to deliver more than just short term economic outcomes. Going forward there may be great opportunities to share data and technical resources that would further enhance our genetic evaluation and ultimately improve our rate of genetic gain. At a more personal level, it is always pleasing to build friendships and share experiences with people that have a passion for breeding Simmental, no matter where they are in the world.









#### IN FIVE KEY POINTS

- Work out the enterprise mix that best suits the property
- Keep that operation as simple as possible
- Work out selection criteria and purchase with these in mind
- Work steadily towards increasing productivity
- Good genetics produce top results and soon pay for themselves

The lessons of life and nature are free, but the consequences can be costly if you don't learn from them. This is the philosophy that has shaped the management of James Mckay at Egremont, south of Lucindale in the south east of South Australia.

Along with wife Georgie and sons Tom (16 yrs), Will (12), Fred (10) and Jock (7), James has learnt from family history and personal experience that it is best to run enterprises that best suit the property and to aim at a good average production base rather than pushing the limits.

Consequently the McKays run a successful livestock grazing operation with a 50:50 cattle/sheep mix on the 1640 hectares of their Egremont property. However they also lease another 475 hectares 20km away and run cattle only on that portion.

They normally run 300 to 350 Simmental/Poll Hereford composite and Angus breeding cows,

including replacement heifers, and 2600 to 2800 Merino/Dohne breeding ewes in their enterprise mix on Egremont.

On the lease block they have had a policy of running dry cattle for management simplicity, but an opportunity that was too good to miss in 2010 saw them buy 450 cows from Western Australia, which altered the mix in the short term. All but 40 of those cattle have now been moved through the system by now and the original policy and balance has been restored.

While James works on keeping management as simple as possible, he also has diversity and flexibility built into it. 2014 saw an extremely early seasonal cut out in the first week in August and numbers were reduced to 250 cows and 1800 breeding ewes. They made the call in mid Septmber that everything sellable went out. They sacrificed some price, but reduced costs and saved the land and pastures. That has been vindicated with the 2015 season which has again seen a disappointing spring.

"Some choose to buy in feed, but we don't and are stocked accordingly. By cutting back numbers early we were able to get a better price than for later sell off, and consequently we were able to carry our remaining stock through very well, plus take on 450 weaner cattle on agistment in July/August on the proviso they were gone by the third week of



November. There wouldn't be many properties in the south east that were able to do that this year," James said.

"If we can improve our profitability without complicating things greatly, then we will pursue those opportunities; but we try to keep things as simple, yet flexible as possible," James said.

"Because of distance and all water on the lease block is reliant on windmills, is why we have bought in local backgrounding steers for that block. These come in at 280 to 300 kg and we sell them at 450 to 500 kg, although grids allow heavier weights up to 580 kg," he said.

The foundation of any grazing enterprise is the quality of the pastures and these in turn are reliant on healthy soils.

Egremont has strong stands of phalaris and rye grass, balanced with subterranean, strawberry and white clover. The McKays use organic fertiliser manufactured by Lawrie  $\vartheta$  Co and applied at approximately 150 kg/hectare.

"Made up mainly of composted manures, this promotes good soil health, organic matter build up and good bug and worm activity without tying up elements, or losing possible benefits from leaching that are common downsides when chemical fertilisers are used," James said.

"After five years of use we are now really seeing the benefits with feed hanging on longer. This was also noticed and commented on by other farmers in the district at a recent inspection day. Things like this do take a few years to take full effect, but we are there now," James said.

There are also 220 hectares of dryland lucerne in the pasture mix that are used for growing out young cattle and lambs.

The McKays employ a rotational grazing system rather than set stocking as this allows paddocks to rest and pastures to revive and strengthen in quality.

"Quietly moving stock regularly with rotational grazing also has the benefit of quieter stock when handling in yards. We also learn that the shortest way is not necessarily the quickest," James said.

With their sheep enterprise the McKays have also built in flexibility, with half the ewes being mated to Dohnes in a self-replacing breeding component and the older half being mated to White Suffolk sires to produce top prime lambs. Their sheep management plan has evolved to suit the overall property. Grazing management is improved with the mix of both sheep and cattle. This ensures most of their prime lambs are gone by November.

"If we shore them all and carried them through to finished heavier weights, it would impact on the growing out of our heifers for the cattle operation," James said.

In the Egremont cattle program, The McKays source their Simmental bulls from the Baker family's Woonallee stud at Furner. Their Angus bulls come from the Glatz's Black Angus and Yerwal studs while their Poll Herefords have come mainly from the Cannawigra stud, and accasionally the Allendale and Days studs. However, they are swinging more towards the black side of the industry. Cannawigra dispersed last year and James said he doesn't envisage needing another Poll Hereford bull for at least 3 years.

"We have around 150 Simmental/Poll Hereford females at present, but that number will probably decrease over time. Our more recent Simmental infusions have been SimAngus, giving heterosis advantages as well," James said.

They look for good bulls that can have a positive impact on the overall enterprise. James has opened eyes in the past by outbidding stud breeders for top Simmental bulls of choice. He explained that these bulls really suited their breeding objectives, having more moderate frame size, easy doing qualities and the capability of producing top grass fed progeny.

"We are utilising the female progeny in our selfreplacing breeding program, so we need high quality bulls that have to have both top maternal and terminal





attributes. Better genetics give us more rapid growth rate and heavier calves at the same age which simply returns us more dollars per head and hectare and quickly covers any higher purchase price. That's what it is all about; improving our bottom line," James said.

"We look at breeding values and study the strength of each bull's sire line history. We also look for positive fat and milk in our British breed bulls and can then look for a higher growth component in the Simmentals with their well-established leanness," James said.

James took over the running of Egremont in 1998, a property that had been in the family for 65 years, after growing up on his parents' neighbouring property, Bokara. He said this greatly influenced his choice of Simmental/British Breed (mainly Poll Hereford) composite cows as the main proportion of their breeding herd for this cross was so successful on Bokara, also making use of heterosis. However, they have also run Angus in the breeding since that time for the marketing options and premiums they offer.

"While supply and demand makes premiums more variable these days, there is still a premium for Angus in marketing options at the least, while historically the MSA Angus grid has given a premium over other MSA grids. There is definitely still a significant premium for the top Black EU weights of around 5 cents/

kg, or more. We get greater growth rates with our Simmental crosses, but our Angus finish earlier. That finish is decided by the critical issue of fat cover with penalties for over 21mm and less than 6mm on the grids," James said.

The McKays mate their cows from the 10th June to drop calves from the third week in March with the bulls in for only six weeks. Angus bulls go over the Angus line and heifers while the Simmentals and Poll Herefords are mated to the composites on type. The short mating period has resulted in a more even drop and while the 'thumper calves' may be gone as a result, the average price is up. Bulls go to 40 to 45 cows and are rotated during joining to freshen and to insure against dry cows from individual bulls not performing as expected.

Cows are pregnancy tested in spring and drys are culled when their condition and value is at its best. Approximately 170 heifers are retained from which the final 100 to be kept annually are selected; usually after the season breaks. The surplus heifers were marketed in Naracoorte, but limited supply saw this sale cancelled for a couple of years, so the McKays then sold at Mt Gambier. However, the Naracoorte sale is now back and coincides with the marketing of the annual draft of Woonallee commercial heifers. This has brought good buying support, with Gippsland producers being strong supporters in particular.

The steers are yard weaned with good lucerne hay that is clean of seeds and sold through the December Naracoorte weaner sale where most buyers prefer yard weaned cattle. The heifers, not kept back as possible breeders generally weigh less, but with restocker competition as the national herd recovers,

they can sometimes make more than the steers. The last sales some 10 to 11 months ago resulted in \$585 for the heifer weaners and \$654 for the steers

There are three seasons in the last decade that have had a real influence on hardening James McKay's resolve that their enterprise and stocking rate policy is the right one.

"After an extremely early seasonal cut out, the summer of 2005/6 hit everyone in the area hard, but many of those who were stocked to good season levels suffered major economic costs and price hits for stock sold off," James said.

With that lesson firmly entrenched, the McKays resisted the temptation to increase their stocking rate as the result of the 2010 summer that was at the other end of the scale. Some others took the punt that they would continue getting high summer rainfall, but James and family were far more cautious.

"We considered it a very high risk strategy that we didn't join that thought pattern. You need to be

prepared for seasonal extremes and not get caught up in short term trends of increasing the breeding herd size in an abnormally good year. You invariably get burnt in the harder years as history shows there is no money in supplementary feeding of livestock for extended periods," James said.

"I believe you do what you think is best and run with it, or you can get left behind. As a result of our decision to downsize the breeding herd and flock in September 2014, and then have it followed with an ordinary season this year meant that we didn't need to quickly go out and buy in replacement breeding stock and we are not feeling the pinch now.

"As with decisions like the one we made last year, you have to get sentiment and emotion out of it. For what it is worth, my advice is to bring your herd to a good average number to give flexibility and to be able to take advantage of favourable circumstances. This prevents flogging paddocks and eliminates, or greatly reduces the need to buy in feed," James concluded.

# SOUND BUSINESS PRINCIPLES DRIVE SAM MUMFORD

## **Cross Calves**

#### **KEY POINTS**

Five Critical Factors

- 1. Livestock mix of beef cattle & prime lambs for diversity and pasture management
- 2. Maximising pasture feed production in line with livestock needs
- 3. Utilising heterosis in livestock production with focus on more meat and less fat
- 4. Easy to manage, stress-free calving
- 5. Minimum chemical use

Kangaroo Island farmer Sam Mumford often jokes he is aiming to produce "Steggles" cattle, and will stick with the Simmental breed to do so.

"The Steggles chicken has always been about more meat and less fat and that's exactly what we are trying to do with our cows," he said.

Based on Kangaroo Island between Parndana and Stokes Bay, the Mumford family of Sam, wife Helen and sons Jack, Nick and Josh and with the assistance of workmen Steve Holland and Red McMulkin, run 450 cows and 4500 White Suffolk-Merino ewes in their livestock breeding enterprises, with this cattle/sheep mix being ideal for pasture utilisation and management in a rotational system.

They have 2430 hectares including 1822 hectares of productive pasture on their three blocks; the home

base, another property five km away and a third block at Gosse. Their pastures are rye grass and sub-clover mix. Mt Barker, Trikala and Gosse sub-clover varieties provide the legume base while Sam is moving away from perennial rye grass and back to annuals, "To get more grass when we need it," he said.

Only cattle are run on their higher rainfall block at Gosse where they do better than sheep, but the mix is maintained on the other two blocks.

They produce premium prime lambs and beef cattle and have acquired a reputation for consistent high quality; often attracting premiums at point of sale.

They also run a stock finishing feedlot, with a 270 yearling cattle and 1000 lamb capacity at any one time. Their own lambs and yearlings are finished where necessary through this feedlot, plus other stock are specifically bought in, including 500 cattle each year. They grow their own barley and hay for the feedlot, but buy in legume grains, either locally if available, or from the mainland.

For Sam Mumford and family, it is sound business principles that are free for all to learn that drive their mixed livestock production enterprises.

"Most people look at their sales for profit, but I've always believed you make your money when you buy," Sam said.

Sam Mumford says his Lancaster Black Simmental bulls are easy to manage. "They are very docile, with high growth and muscling and easy calvers. I haven't had to pull a single calf in the past seven years", he said.

This does not mean that Sam looks for the cheapest inputs, but rather inputs that can be value added.

He also looks to get "free" advantages on offer in production systems, such as heterosis.

The Mumfords don't run conventional breeding herds and flocks. They combine three outstanding production cattle breeds, Angus, Simmental and Gelbvieh in their breeding cow herd, then cross Black Simmental bulls from the Lancaster stud of Meningie as their terminal sires as they best suited their market specifications. This is utilising production and maternal attributes from all these breeds and maximising heterosis advantages offered through crossbreeding.

"We are always chasing hybrid vigour, that's the free ride all commercial producers can take advantage of," Sam said.

In explaining why they use Black Simmentals Mr Mumford said, "Our Woolworths buyer prefers black cattle, and I prefer the extra muscle. An injection of European blood means more meat and less fat," he said.

The Mumfords have been buying three to four bulls a year from the Meningie-based Lancaster stud for the past six years, after meeting principals Tim and Henry Cartledge during the SA Beef Field Days. Mr Mumford said the stud had similar breeding goals to his own.

"We look for high 400 day growth and EMA figures with slightly positive fat in our Black Simmental bull

purchases, as these are the traits that most align with our production system and target markets of 250 to 280kg carcase weight at 12 months, ideally with 11 millimetres of fat," Sam said.

We don't worry about birthweight EBVs. Birthweight is a management issue as far as I'm concerned and selecting for low birthweight to control birthing problems is just lazy management. We manage it and I haven't pulled a calf in the last seven years," Sam said.

Joining begins at the beginning of June and runs for six weeks. Mr Mumford said they prefer a tight calving so the calves are similar in size when they "come out the other end of the system" in March-April.

Pregnancy testing in October by ScanStock's Jock Waller identifies underperformers, with dry cows not given a second chance. In 2014, Mr Mumford said they recorded only 12 dry cows out of 450 breeders, a level he was very pleased with.

Cows and calves run on subclover and ryegrass pastures until January, before being weaned, weighed and sorted into weight groups in the feedlot.

Sam explained they aim for two markets with their young cattle. The calves that are 350kg or better are put in the feedlot to be taken through to 550 to 580kg liveweight for Woolworths, which is achieved at 12 to 13 months of age. The lighter vealers are finished to around 450kg and sent to Naracoorte where these weights are highly sought and sell well.



As an insurance against another poor season, the Mumfords cut and stored approximately twelve hundred bales of hay. "We have always cut hay just in case we have a tight start," Sam said. He said if all was needed it will have got them through until July. In a normal year they cut 1500 bales.

Last year the heaviest calves were 450kg going into the feedlot, the lightest were about 350kg.

They are then weighed every 20 days until sold. The finishing ration in the feedlot consists of 70 per cent barley and 15pc hay (grown on-farm) and 15pc of bought-in legumes.

They are also fed a Ridleys Feedlot 80 mineral mix which is combined with 20 litres of molasses and 200L of water. Mr Mumford prides himself in minimising any chemical use on-farm.

"We don't use growth hormones in the feedlot or anything like that," he said.

Mr Mumford said all stock were given a mineral drench of Maximin every three months, which they responded well to.

"While this is God's country down here, we are very mineral deficient," he said.

Homebred calves were mainly sold at 12-14 months, while purchased cattle (usually spring drops bought in winter) were fed out to 14-16 months. All are trucked off the property for slaughter by January and before the next weaning.

This year, Mr Mumford's first draft of Simmental cross calves, weighed 279kg carcase weight at 16 months of age when sold in early January and averaged \$1100. He aimed to average \$1000, so was very happy with that transaction.

"Prices were exceptionally good at that time and fortunately have since got better, but the following four months were character building," he said.

"The season was very tough, with rain shutting off in August last year," he said.

"The average rainfall is generally 610 millimetres on the home property up to 1016mm rainfall country in the west. However, in last year's growing season, we only received 457mm.

"We were able to carry our lambs through on our paddock feed but that was it. We had to hand feed the rest."

Of the 2430ha property, 1822ha is pasture, while 160ha of barley and 100ha of oats/rye is grown for hay and feed.

Last year's barley crop averaged 2.5t/ha, which was kept for stockfeed.

Left-over yearlings and lambs that did not make the feedlot weight cut-off (350kg for cattle) were initially grown out on the barley stubbles.

Mr Mumford said this also helped breakdown stubbles before paddocks are returned to pasture in the following year.

In a general sense, some see problems where Sam sees opportunity. Results suggest he converts that opportunity into positive results on a very regular basis. "It's no good being a pessimist. That job is already taken," Sam concluded.

#### Behind the headline

THE Mumford family business on Kangaroo Island began in 1979, when Ron Mumford from Redhill in the Mid North bought a property at Parndana to fatten wethers. Initially they relied on outside staff, but Sam found he was spending more time on KI than with his family back at Redhill. Therefore the shift over full time with the family in 2000 was a logical move to make.

They then introduced crossbred ewes to the operation and began breeding cattle in 2002 which has since become a major enterprise with 450 breeders. They also run 4500 White Suffolk-Merino cross ewes.

"Kangaroo Island exports heaps of feed quality grain and lots of store stock. However, it is such a fantastic breeding area, so I thought, why not combine the two. Rather than exporting a cheap bulk commodity and a store animal, we are aiming to send off one quality product with only one lot of freight. It's a no brainer really," Sam said.

# **Borthwick Trophy**

A Simmental team has won the prestigious Borthwick Trophy at this year's Royal Melbourne Show, carcase competition after a recount.

During the 62 years the Borthwick Trophy has been running, Simmental have entered only three times for two wins and a second place.

The trophy is judged on an accumulation of points, firstly on the hoof and then on the hook. Carcases are judged within the general parameters of the Australian Beef Carcase Appraisal System (ABCAS), incorporating carcase attributes relevant to market specifications and Meat Standards Australia (MSA) developed eating quality standards.

The team of three Simmental steers won the award with a total of 321.89 points out of a possible 400.

Second place went to the Limousin steers with 318.84 points and third place went to the Charolais steers with 316.11 points.

The team of three Simmental steers included a 17-month -old steer bred and exhibited by Lewis Bruggemann from Mallala, South Australia, a 11-month-old steer bred and exhibited by Webb Black Simmentals from Glenburn and a 19-month-old steer also bred and exhibited by Webb Black Simmentals.



#### Awarded a member of the Order of Australia

A renowned cattleman and cattle industry figure, Richard William Vincent was awarded an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) medal in the Queen's Birthday Awards for his distinguished service to the beef cattle industry, on a state, national and international level.

Dick was on the Federal Council of the Australia Simmental Breeders Association with six terms as President and served for 18 years on the Western Australia Simmental Council with seven terms as president. He was also on the World Simmental Federation for 12 years serving as president for three years and is a life member of the Australia Simmental Breeders Association.

The 90-year-old was honoured to receive national recognition for his work while he was still alive. Mr Vincent's love of cattle began when his grandmother gave him a heifer calf when he was eight-years-old, so he can proudly say he has been in the industry for 82 years.

The Australian Simmental Breeders Association congratulate him on this award and for being a major part of the Simmental breed.

### Performance Recording Mature Cow Weight

EEF PRODUCERS need to balance the gains of running heavy cows with the cost of maintaining those cows. Depending on the type of country and market prices it may be more profitable to run moderate sized breeding cows rather than large cows.

Beef producers can improve their profits and cut costs by tailoring the weight of their breeding cows to suit their country and market trends.

### WHY SHOULD MATURE COW WEIGHT BE RECORDED?

The weight of mature cow has a considerable influence on herd profitability. In general, lighter cows tend to have lower feed requirements and be more efficient to maintain compared to heavier cows.

The returns from cull cows can make up a significant proportion of the total income of a beef breeding business. In most situations heavier weight cows will return more per head than lighter weight cows. However beef producers need to consider the cost of maintaining heavy cows over their lifetime. In addition, while higher mature weight cows generally produce heavier weight weaners, the number of calves produced per cow joined tends to decrease with increasing mature cow weight.

Using EBVs in bull selection has the added benefit of allowing producers to identify bulls that are "curve benders" for post-birth growth such as 600 day growth and mature cow weight. That is, they produce calves that have genetics for above average post-birth growth but moderate mature cow weight genetics in the retained daughters. This breeding technique can be used to breed moderate, fertile cows but not to the detriment of the growth rates of slaughter progeny such as steers.

### INTERPRETING MATURE COW WEIGHT EBVS

Mature cow weight EBVs are estimates of the genetic differences between cows in live weight at five years of age and are expressed in kilograms.

A bull with higher, more positive Mature Cow Weight EBVs is expected to produce daughters with, on average, heavier mature cow weights than bulls with lower Mature Cow Weight EBVs.

The optimal mature cow weight will depend on the individual herd and its breeding objective. For example:

- Breeders looking to decrease the mature weight of their cows may look for lower Mature Cow Weight FBVs.
- Breeders looking to increase their returns from the sale of cull cows may look for higher Mature Cow Weight EBVs.
- Breeders looking to maintain the mature size of their breeding cows while maximising the growth of their progeny to say 600 days may look for moderate Mature Cow Weight EBVs.

### RECORDING INFORMANTION ON MATURE COW WEIGHT

Mature cow weight EBVs are generated from the live weights of mature cows that are recorded within two weeks of the weaning weight (200 day weight) of their calves, with up to four weights analysed per cow. For temperate breeds, BREEDPLAN will only analyse a mature cow weight if the cow is older than 2.4 years of age (870 days) at weighing. For tropical breeds, this age is 3.0 years (1090 days). Weights are not analysed from cows that do not have a calf weighed at weaning.

As with all weights, mature cow weight should be recorded using appropriate (and accurate) scales. Do not guess or estimate mature cow weight or use measuring tapes to calculate mature cow weight. Either weigh the cows using appropriate scales or don't record mature cow weights.

Mature Cow Weight EBVs for bulls are generated from the mature cow weight performance of all known female relatives such as dam, grand dams, half sisters and daughters. In addition, relationships with other traits, such as 600 day growth, are also used in the calculation of Mature Cow Weight EBVs.

All cows with a calf at 200 days should be weighed each year. Do not try to "guess" whether a cow has had 4 weights taken previously – the BREEDPLAN analysis will sort it out for you.

BREEDPLAN will only analyse the mature cow weight performance of a cow if her first valid mature cow weight has been taken before she is 6 years of age (2200 days). If not, then none of her mature weights will be analysed.

It is essential that correct management group information is recorded with mature cow weight performance. Management groups work slightly differently for mature cow weights. If no management group information is defined for a set of mature cow weights, the BREEDPLAN analysis will use the management groups submitted with the 200 day weights of their calves to sub-group the weights of the cows. Therefore, if you have correctly recorded the management group information with the 200 day weight performance for your calves, then you only need to assign a different management group to a cow that has experienced an effect on her weight that is different to that experienced by her calf. For example, if the cow was injured/sick or has been supplementary fed.

If both the mature cow weights and the 200 day weights for their calves are submitted without management group information, the BREEDPLAN analysis will assume all cows and calves have been run under similar management conditions.

Optionally, cow condition score can also be submitted with mature cow weight information. Condition scores are not currently included in the BREEDPLAN analysis however they may be used in the future when determining Mature Cow Weight EBVs. If breeders wish to record condition scores, it is important that the standard fat scoring system of 1-6 be used (only whole scores) and the same person scores all cows in the herd at a particular weighing.

### SUBMITTING MATURE COW WEIGHT INFORMATION TO BREEDPLAN

Mature cow weights can be submitted directly to BREEDPLAN. The process to submit mature cow weight data is the same as submitting any other performance data. Mature cow weights can be submitted using:

- · Paper performance recording forms.
- The Microsoft Excel Weights & Scanning Information template available on the BREEDPLAN website.
- A data extract from a BREEDPLAN compatible herd recording program.
- Via the Internet Solutions facility on the BREEDPLAN website (for participate Breed Societies).

#### DO:

- ✓ Record mature cow weights on all cows. BREEDPLAN will work out which weights will be analysed.
- ✓ Measure mature cow weight at weaning or within two weeks of recording a 200 day weight on the calves.
- ✓ Record management group information with mature cow weight performance.

### Performance Recording Birth Weight

D IRTH WEIGHT is an important economic trait in beef production systems as lower birth weights are associated with reduced incidence of calving difficulty, but unfavourably correlated with growth rate. Careful management of birth weight by beef producers is therefore required to ensure that calving difficulties are minimised while growth rates are increased or maintained.

#### WHY RECORD BIRTH WEIGHT?

Calving difficulty has an obvious negative impact on the profitability of a herd through increased calf and heifer mortality, slower re-breeding performance and considerable additional labour and veterinary expense.

Calving difficulty in a herd is influenced by many genetic and environmental factors. These genetic factors influencing calving difficulty include birth weight of the calf, calf shape, pelvic size and calving "will". Of all the genetic factors influencing calving ease, birth weight of the calf is the most important.

Given this, beef producers interested in managing calving difficulties within their herd should consider recording the birth weight of their calves. This birth weight data is then used in the calculation of Birth Weight EBVs. These Birth Weight EBVs provide important information to beef producers when making breeding decisions, especially when selecting bulls to breed to heifers.

Recording birth weights is also an important way to identify 'curve benders' - those animals which have low or moderate Birth Weight EBVs and above average EBVs for later growth. These animals are of particular interest in the beef industry as generally animals with lower birth weights have lower growth

### INTERPRETING BIRTH WEIGHT EBVS EQUIPMENT FOR RECORDING BIRTH WEIGHT

Birth weight EBVs are estimates of the genetic difference between animals for calf birth weight. Birth weight EBVs are expressed in kilograms.

Small or moderate birth weight EBVs are more favourable, and indicate lighter birth weights. For example, a bull with a birth weight EBV of +1 kg would be expected to produce lighter calves at birth than a bull with a birth weight EBV of +7 kg, with a lower risk of a difficult birth.

While lower birth weight EBVs are favourable for calving ease, they have a negative correlation with later growth. This has two major consequences:

- Lower birth weight sires may cause fewer calving difficulties but they will also tend to produce calves with poorer growth to target market endpoints.
- The female progeny from lower birth weight sires will tend to grow into smaller heifers who themselves may have increased calving difficulty as two year olds.

Thus it is important that breeders do not make selection decision on Birth Weight EBVs alone, but consider all traits of economic importance including growth rate. Fortunately, animals with low or moderate Birth Weight EBVs and above average EBVs for later growth do exist. Recording birth weights will help identify these 'curve bender' animals.

When recording the birth weight of calves, it is important that producers collect accurate birth weights. This ensures that the data being submitted to BREEDPLAN and used to calculate birth weight EBVs is of a good quality. Therefore, it is important that producers weigh the calf using scales, and don't estimate the weight of the calf from the girth or chest size of the animal.

There are a number of methods which are currently used by beef producers to record calf birth weight. These range from the use of bathroom scales through to commerically available products developed specifically for measuring calf birth weight. Some common methods include:

#### Sling and clock-face scales

This method involves securing the calf with a sling and hoisting it from the ground to record the weight. Calves can be lifted by the producer. Alternatively, a hoist can be mounted onto a four-wheel motorbike, farm vehicle or tractor, and the hoist can do the lifting for you.



#### Platform scales

Producers can stand on platform scales, holding the calf. The weight of the producer can then be deducted from the combined weight of the producer and calf, giving the weight of the calf. Alternatively, calves can be secured on a platform and, as with the sling and clock-face scale method discussed above, hoisted into the air with a hoist mounted on a vehicle.



#### Calf Weighing Cradles

Commercially available calf weighing cradles can be used to measure birth weight.

#### DO:

Use scales to record the birth weight of your calves.

#### DON'T:

- ✓ Guess the birth weight of the calf.
- ✓ Use girth/chest size to estimate birth weight.



### RECORDING BIRTH WEIGHT - BEST PRACTICE

The weight of a calf fluctuates throughout its first week of life. Therefore, when recording birth weight, it is important to record the birth weight as close to the birth of the calf as possible. BREEDPLAN recommends that birth weight is recorded within the first 24 hours of a calf's life.

It is important that the birth weight of the entire calf crop is recorded, including dead calves. This is because BREEDPLAN uses comparisions within contemporary groups when calculating the EBVs of an animal. If only one calf has a birth weight recorded, then it will be in a single animal contemporary group, and its own performance data will not contribute towards the calculation of its Birth Weight EBV. In addition, recording the birth weights of a subset of calves (e.g. the lighter calves) will bias the EBVs as the birth weights are not representative of the entire calf crop.

As with any trait, when submitting birth weights to BREEDPLAN, it is important to accurately record management groups. Where cows have been run under different management conditions prior to the birth of their calves, and these management conditions may effect birth weight, birth management groups should be recorded. For example, a producer may run two mobs of cows in different paddocks. If the cows in mob one have access to more feed prior to calving, this will influence the birth weight of their calves. Birth management groups should therefore be recorded in this situation. Similarly, if the dam is sick or injured prior to calving, they should be placed in a separate birth management group to the rest of the calves.

Some beef producers have been injured by protective cows when attempting to collect birth weights. Please

take due care when collecting birth weights to ensure that you are not injured.

#### DO:

- Record birth weight for all calves, including dead calves
- ✓ Ideally, measure birth weight within 24 hours of birth.
- ✓ Record birth management groups if cows have had different management conditions prior to birth which may effect birth weight. E.g. some cows having access to more feed.
- ✔ Record premature calves in a separate birth management group.
- ✔ Be vigilant for protective mothers while weighing calves.

### SUBMITTING BIRTH WEIGHT INFORMATION TO BREEDPLAN

Birth weight information on calves can be submitted to the relevant Breed Society at the time of registration. The majority of birth weight data analysed by BREEDPLAN is submitted in this way.

Alternatively, birth weights can be submitted directly to BREEDPLAN. The process to submit

birth weight data is the same as submitting any other performance data. Birth weights can be submitted using:

- · Paper performance recording forms.
- The Microsoft Excel Weights & Scanning Information template available on the BREEDPLAN website.
- A data extract from a BREEDPLAN compatible herd recording program.
- Via the Internet Solutions facility on the BREEDPLAN website (for participate Breed Societies).

## Guide to Using BREEDPLAN Information in Animal Selection

HE BREEDING ANIMALS which a beef producer selects for the herd will have a large impact on the profitability of the herd, both now and in the future. Profitability of the herd will be influenced by the number of calves (fertility), the weight of the calves (growth) and the quality of the calves (carcase), less the cost of production. All of these factors contributing to profitability are influenced to some degree by genetics, and thus can be selected for.

The breeding animals which a beef producer selects for the herd will impact upon the genetic progress (or lack therefore) that the indivudal herd makes over time. Bulls in particular have a large impact on the genetic direction of the herd, as they tend to produce more offspring than an individual cow (with the possible exception of cows flushed for ET). In herds where daughters are retained for breeding purposes, the impact of an individual bull in a breeding program can span generations, as his daughters continue to pass on his genetics to their own offspring.

Beef producers should view the selection and purchase of an indivdual breeding animal as a long term investment, which will have lasting impacts on both the profitability and genetic progress of the herd. Therefore, it is important that beef producers spend time on both the bulls and cows they are considering purchasing, and select the most profitable animals for their particular production system.

### BEST PRACTICE GUIDE TO ANIMAL SELECTION

There are a number of things which BREEDPLAN recommends beef producers consider when deciding which animals to purchase, or which animals to retain within the herd.

#### These are:

- Identify the selection index of most relevance to you
- 2. Rank animals on selection index
- 3. Consider individual EBVs
- 4. Consider other information

#### Identify the selection index of most relevance to You

Most breed socieities have developed selection indexes using the BreedObject software. The selection indexes currently available for Australian breed socieities are shown in Table 1. Each selection index has been developed for a specific production to market scenario. Some selection indexes are maternal (self-replacing), meaning that females are retained for breeding and therefore emphasis has been placed on fertility traits such as Days to Calving. Other selection indexes are terminal, meaning that all calves are sent to slaughter. In terminal selection indexes, there is no emphasis on fertility traits.

A full explanation of each selection index is available in the breed specific selection index tipsheet, available in the technical section of the BREEDPLAN website. These tipsheets include a description of each selection index, the profit drivers underlying each selection index (blue graph), the EBV Weightings for each selection index (red graph), and the predicted response for each trait if a beef producer was to select sires in the top 10% for the relevant selection index only (green graph).

When considering which selection index is of most relevance to the beef operation, beef producers should pay close attention to the green graph provided in the selection index Tipsheets. This green graph allows the beef producer to identify which direction each of the BREEDPLAN traits will move if they were to select sires in the top 10% of the breed for the particular selection index. Beef producers can then assess whether using a particular selection index will assist them to move their herd in the direction they wish to go.




Figure 1. The predicted response on each individual trait of selecting bulls in the top 10% of the breed for the Charolais Domestic Index.

For example, in Figure 1, the predicted responses for the Charolais Domestic Index are shown. As can be seen from Figure 1, selecting the top 10% of sires using the Charolais Domestic Index would drive an increase in both Calving Ease Direct and Calving Ease Daugthers, while decreasing Birth Weight and Gestation Length. 200, 400 and 600 Day Weights

would increase, while Mature Cow Weight would decrease slightly. Milk and Scrotal Size would both increase. Carcase Weight, Rib Fat, Rump Fat and IMF would also increase, while Eye Muscle Area and Retail Beef Yield would both decrease.

If none of the selection indexes developed by your breed society are relevant to your situation, it is possible to create your own customised selection index using the BreedObject software. For more information on how to develop your own customised selection index, visit the Breed Object website: http://www.breedobject.com/

#### 2. Rank animals on selection index

Once a beef producer has decided which selection index is the most relevant to their situation, animals being considered for purchase should be ranked on selection index. This can be done using the online 'EBV Enquiry' function in Internet Solutions (for participating breed societies). Animals can also be ranked by selection index within an individual sale catalogue on Internet Solutions.

#### 3. Consider individual EBVs

Once animals have been ranked on the selection index of relevance, it is important to consider individual EBVs for specific traits of interest. This is because a selection index is a weighted index, with

multiple EBVs contributing to the final selection index value. Therefore, animals which have the same selection index can have very different EBVs for an individual trait.

An example of this is seen in Table 2, where five animals have a selection index value of \$140. While the selection index value is the same, these five animals have very different EBVs for a number of individual traits. For example, Bull 1 has a Calving Ease Direct EBV of +6.7 %, while Bull 5 has a Calving Ease Direct EBV of -1.0 %. The birth weights of these five bulls also varies, with Bull 1 having a Birth Weight EBV of +2.5 kg and Bull 2 having a Birth Weight EBV of +5.6 kg. The individual EBVs also differ for several of the carcase traits, with Bull 4 has a EMA EBV of +3.5 cm2 and Bull 2 has an EMA EBV of +6.2 cm2.

In addition, some traits, such as docility, are not currently included in the selection index. To address this, BREEDPLAN recommends that beef producers rank animals on the relevant selection index as a first step. In the second step, individual EBVs for traits of importance should be considered to ensure that they fit with the breeding objectives of the beef producer. For example, a beef producer may rank animals on the selection index, and then do a secondary selection by removing any animals which are below breed average for docility.

#### 4. Consider other information

There is often a range of other information available on sale bulls. This information can include the following:

- Pedigree
- Bull Breeding Soundness Examination (BBSE) results
- Structural soundness
- DNA test results for genetic conditions

BREEDPLAN recommends that when beef producers are making selection decisions, they also consider the other information available on the animal before making a final selection decision. Analysing the pedigree of an animal allows beef producers to make an assessment of how closely related the particular animal is to their herd. This allows beef producers to avoid excessive levels of inbreeding within their herd.


The Bull Breeding Soundness Examination provides an objective measurement of a bull's fertility. Similarly, a visual appraisal of the bull allows beef producers to assess whether the bull is structurally sound. After all, a bull might have EBVs which are in the top 1% of the breed for all traits, but unless he is fertile and structurally sound, and thus successfully able to serve cows and produce calves, then his EBVs are irrelevant.


Lastly, BREEDPLAN recommends that any DNA test results are considered. These could include DNA test results for horned/polled status, or DNA test results for any genetic conditions which are prevelant in the particular breed.

Buying a bull is a long term investment, and will have a lasting impact on the profitability and genetic progress of the herd. Therefore it is important that beef producers spend the time to ensure they make the best selection decision for their breeding objectives.




### Genetic Trends Graphs in Simmental Spanning from 1996 - 2014

Breeder animals can be exported travelling to several different countries around the world. Two of AUSTREX's major of which orders nominally breeder destinations are in China and Russia. Orders for these markets will be given to cover both Category 1 and Category 2 type animals.

These categories cover the breeding details by determining eligibility of the animals in gaining necessary registration papers through breed societies. Selection criteria for unjoined animals is age will usually be from between 6 to 18 months with animals being unjoined, but this however can depend on order requirements.

#### **CATEGORY 1:**

- 1. Category 1 animals require information, which covers 3 generations on both the dam's side and the sire's side
- 2. Animals MUST have a tattoo and/or be branded with animal number and farm prefix prior to delivery at quarantine.
- Animals MUST be 'true to type' as breed inspection is completed by the ILRIC inspector on arrival at quarantine.

#### **CATEGORY 2:**

- All animals MUST have RFID tags's at time of selection and be registered on PIC of property where purchased.
- 2. Category 2 animals require information which covers 3 generations on the sire's side only.
- 3. For multi-sire animals form will be required to list all the bulls (sire's) used.
- 4. All bulls used must be registered to the vendor.
- 5. Animals MUST be 'true to type' as breed inspection is completed by the ILRIC inspector on arrival at quarantine.

Depending on the market, selection can be conducted on farm with an AUSTREX Livestock buyer and/or accompanied with the end buyer from the importing country. Animals are tagged in both ears with "export shipment tags" which provide an individual unique number to carry to that particular animal throughout all the protocol and selection process.

During this process, all details and events will be scanned and recorded into our database against that animal's unique number. All breeding information will be supplied by the vendor at selection.

Some markets require disease testing to be done on farm, prior to AUSTREX's confirmation of delivery to the quarantine facility. The testing, if required, is organised and paid for by AUSTREX using qualified veterinarians throughout the process. All animals will be are required to be yarded for testing which is, organised by AUSTREX vets, usually by phone.

Typically, depending on individual shipments, animals test results will come back around 24 days after the bleed process. A list of eligible and rejected (if any) animals will be sent to you via email with transporting instructions to quarantine.

Animals within the Bluetongue Free Zone are usually required for most shipments. Please visit go to the Animal Health Australia website; http://namp. animalhealthaustralia.com.au/public.php for your zoning details.

Upon arrival to quarantine the animals will be are inspected for health (warts, ringworm, eye disease,

injuries, true to type inspection and breeding soundness (by manual palpation with accredited vet) prior to being accepted to start the quarantine process. All eligible animals will be reported to the agent/vendor after 7 days for invoicing immediately so payments can be made within 14 days of delivery.

AUSTREX has a team of livestock buyers that will help throughout the entire process including supplying all the necessary paperwork at the time of selection.

Information will then be sent to the AUSTREX head office where we will organise all the necessary details for registration of animals. In some instances, you may receive a call to assist with any missing information, which is usually easily fixed.

AUSTREX is continuously in the market buying animals, so for any inquiries please contact our friendly staff who can assist in directing you to your local representative or agent.







Sydney Show 2105 Purebred Steer Competition taking home an array of medals and awards for producers and exhibitors and further highlighting the carcase attributes of the Simmental breed, now proven to be amongst the best in the country.

In the prestigious Stan Hill Trophy, Simmentals finished a close second on 264.5 points behind the first placed Limousin team on 267 points, and well ahead of the third and fourth placed Murray Grey and Angus teams on 256.5 and 255 points respectively. The Stan Hill competition involves the selection by a breed representative of the best 3 steers in each breed within the Purebred Steer Competition whose points on the hook are then combined for the final result. The Simmental team comprised steers bred by Alan Anderson of Wendouree Simmentals and exhibited by Macarthur Anglican College, John and Nicole Hopkins of Wormbete Simmentals whose steer was exhibited by the students of Murrumburrah High School, with the final steer in the Simmental team ably bred and exhibited by Miss Jessica Impey of Lucky Clover Simmentals. These three steers were also each awarded Silver Medals in the Carcase Competition further reinforcing their individual carcase attributes, which when combined earned them the reputable second place Stan Hill ribbon.

Although small in numbers compared to some other breeds, almost every Simmental entry in the Purebred Steer Competition achieved a Medal in the Carcase section of the Competition. Of note, was the Gold Medal awarded to Jason and Jacqui Impey of Mala-Daki Simmentals in the 529-556kg Heavyweight Division whose steer took out the top honours in this division with a score of 92 points out of a possible 100.
