 SMITHFIELDSimmental cross catile had remarkable achievements in both obvious and not so obvious ways in the 'live and carcase" classes at the Royal Smithfield Show in London in early December (Dec. 3-7).

There were just 11 Simmental crosses among the 74 animals forward in this section of the show, and the 74 were divided into nine classes, first by age and then by weight. All the classes were judged - alive on the first day of the show, as carcases on the third day - by Mr. Tom Lauchlan of Glasgow, a leading member of Britain's Fatstock Marketing Corporation.

He produced a remarkable uniformity in his live and carcase results - rarely varying by more than one place for any leading animal in the two sets of placings even though, of course, he was not aware which animal he was judging at any particular moment.

The Simmental crosses were awarded three 1st prizes ,two 2 nds and a third in the live classes, and two first, two seconds and two thirds in the carcase classes. Although just over a seventh of the total entries, the Simmentals took nearly a quarter of the leading awards and more than a quarter of the first prizes.

The not so obvious, but perhaps even greater, success in current British conditions, were the high weights achieved by the Simmental entries in the carcase classes. Graded by live-weight per day of age (that is, ignoring calf weights), ten of the 11 Simmentals were among the top half of the 74 animals of all breeds forward.

The top 37 animals had live weights per day of age ranging from 1.88 lb . to 3.45 lb . The eleventh Simmental just failed to be in this top bracket.

Moreover the Simmentals tended to be clustered
of them were among the top nine in the carcase section. They ranged down to 2.41 lb . per day of age and, of course, represented a higher proportion than any other breed in this top weight bracket.
"The results seem to indicate that the Simmental can now be regarded as a leading breed both in weight gains and in quality, even among the quite numerous entries of other European breeds," commented Mr. Brian Freeman, secretary of the British Simmental Cattle Society.

The leading Simmental awards were gained by animals from the north of England. Ouston Spring

## WHAT COLOUR IS

## YOUR BULL?

## (By D. G. Mactaggart, Waterloo Grazing Co.,

 Glen InnesThis question has been asked of me many times since we bought the first pure-bred Simmental bull calf sold for export from New Zeaand on October 23, 1973. Since that time, have felt compelled to write down my thoughts which may be of assistance to other enthusiasts of the colour fad
As every Simmental breeder should know by now, the colour variance of the breed ranges from light dun to deep red, and it would be hard to find two pure-bred animals with identical colour and markings as in Herefords, Brafords, or any other breed.
If we are breeding up from Herefords, then we $50 \%$ simmental that our first cross calves are $50 \%$ Simmental, and as Simmentals have a large in colour it means we are running true to type specially if the sire is light in colour:

I have been actively
As I have been actively engaged in the hide business for the past twenty-six years, and we buy assure the members that we neither pay premiums nor discount hides because of their colour.
As a breeder of Simmentals, I am interested in the amount of beef I can produce per acre compared with any other breed under the same conditions, and the colour of the hide has nothing to do with the amount of cutable beef inside it. The only thing the hide is doing is keeping the carcase together, and it can be any colour and do he same job.
I would suggest, therefore, that if breeders are looking for colour, they already have a wide variety of choice: If they want black, they can then they should breed either Herefords or Braords; or pure red, there is always Santa Gertrudis or Droughtmasters. But if they want an animal that has a good milk supply and exceptionally oood post-weaning weight gains, plus naturally marbled beef, then I would suggest they breed Simmentals.
The answer to the above question is that our ull is a light dun colour, but more importantly, he weighed 801b. at birth, he was unassisted, and he is putting on an average of 3.81 b . per day on

As many of you are about to make a decision n what to do with these animals the Council is concerned that you all know of it's attitude.
After one of the longest debates in the Association's history, continuing over several meetings, the Council decided that members should not be encouraged to produce and sell these bulls.

C. Over $\$ 4,000$ is to be offered as prizes for Simmental cross animals winning carcase competitions this year. This is seen as an encouragement to members to concentrate on steer production as well as being important for its effect on providing publicity for the breed. The Association hopes o double this prize money in the near future.
D. The Performance Recording Service ofered to bulls is also offered to steers but at less The Council did

## Enzeders Huy Pie Thouge in France

As Australians can still only buy live cattle from New Zealand, the following report by Mr. Ran Macdonald, well known to Australian breeders, which appeared in the Simmental Cattle Breeders' Society of N.Z.'s last Newsletter, will be of interest to members.

Mr. Macdonald's report:
"Any misgivings which I may have had about the quality of Pie Rouge cattle soon evaporated when we visited the first three herds of M. Collaud. I found very big stretchy cattle definitely longer than the Fleckvieh with more leg under certainly more than adequately so.
"My problem with the selection was the limited number of calves available in each herd. Seventy per cent of the Pie Rouge calve in the autumn and all these were outside our age limits. Of the $30 \%$ these also were earlier than April 15, which was to be our deadline date.

They will be part of an offering of approximately 60 head of cattle comprising a progeny sale from Miss Garside's well known "Bogar" Guernseys.

The Simmentals are. with the exception of 2 heifers which are from Friesian and Guernsey base cows, all from pure bred Guernsey base cows.
Two of the base cows are three-quarter sisters to Miss Garside's celebrated Bogar Rosalinda 6th, who established a State milk record in 1973 and was supreme dairy cow (all breeds) at Perth Royal Show, 1973.
The Simmental progeny of these sisters are one male, 4 months and one female, 9 months of age.
Visitors to the stud are frequently impressed by the size and scale of Miss Garside's Guernseys and this is reflected in the Simmental progeny.
Experimentally, Miss Garside mated several Shorthorn cows with Simmental. However, the progeny of the Guernsey base cows are outstrip
ping the Shorthorn cross calves and consequntly Miss Garside is now breeding exclusively from Guernseys.

To date no calving difficulty whatsoever has occurred in any Simmental births.

"The main lesson to be learned from the exercise was that if we go back to purchase more Pie Rouge cattle, and I strongly recommend that we should, then we should go in March-April when we would have $70 \%$ of the calf drop to choose from.
"I saw many splendid females weighing 1,700 to $1,800 \mathrm{lb}$. and odd ones producing up to 20,000 lb . of milk in one lactation of less than 300 days. The calves were in general not well done with of course nothing suckled on their mothers. All dams, and where possible sires, were inspected before a calf was selected, and if these calves grow out to be as good as their dams we will have some very good cattle.
"We as a society are much indebted to Ernie Dodd who was a tremendous help to us, and to the other breed societies, particularly in our rather difficult dealings with Confranimex before we started our selection. We had to battle for the right to select our cattle on the farm where the herd and in particular 'la mere' could be seen, instead of selecting from a mob of thirty or forty calves collected from one area into one spot.
"We also achieved the right to barter with each individual farmer instead of accepting flat prices overall. This meant that we were able to buy the great majority of our calves well under Cofranimex's set price, but we were also able to buy many choice calves which would never have been brought out for sale at their figure.
"The average price for the Pie Rouge will be, I think, appreciably under $\$ 10,000$ landed in New Zealand. This price will also include an insurance policy costing $11 \%$ which will cover these heifers for transit ex Le Havre, through quarantine and to one month after calving on the New Zealand farm, with a time limit of fifteen months on farm.
"The policy includes a cover against infertility, genetic defects, and the possibility of heifers being already in calf when they leave France. These three factors will be covered by Cofranimex for $3 \%$ of the total premium. leaving the balance of $8 \%$ to be paid by the New Zealand purchaser.
"We should be grateful to the Animal Health Department and particularly to David Collyns for ably organising this venture. M. Maziere, the Secretary of the Pie Rouge Society, who has I think been with the Society for twelve years and who has played rugby for France, was extremely able and helpful.
"Christian, our interpreter and secretary to the Cofranimex chief, M. Bardot, can only be described as delightful, and if you want full meetings of members, bring her over to replace Mac Studholme as Secretary."
