



SIMMENTALS PART OF WINNING FORMULA FOR CARTLEDGE FAMILY'S BEEF OPERATION

If recent success is anything to go by, the Cartledge family of Lancaster Black Simmentals is onto a winning formula in their South Australian beef program.

Trading as Menalpyn Pty Ltd, Henry Cartledge and his wife, Prue, along with his parents, Tim and Lise, have been breeding Black Simmental cattle on their ancient sand dune country for the last 20 years.

Specialising in the production of a Black Simmental/ Angus-cross on their 3643 hectare property, Menalpyn, the family brought home plenty of awards from the 17th Annual Southern Grassfed Carcase Classic in May.

Henry Cartledge said they entered 32 Black Simmental/Angus-cross heifers in the carcase competition, which attracted 1700 cattle from across the southern states of Australia.

"We were thrilled to win the best team of 10 animals for the second year in a row, the best team of three animals, single steer or heifer 180-260 kilograms, and place second and third in the single steer or heifer 260-340kg," Mr Cartledge said.

"We also won reserve champion carcase with our second-placed heifer, which recorded figures of

10mm of P8 fat, 6mm of rib fat, EMA of 84, and MSA marble score of 310. Most of the animals were steers, but ours were replacement heifers that were preg-tested negative. Going back to back with the team of ten was pretty amazing."

Mr Cartledge said he felt the competition was very industry relevant, and believes what gave them the edge was their successful blend of Black Simmental and Angus breeds.

"I think it's probably the blending of both breeds, which is why we selected to go with the Black Simmental as we thought it had a huge role to play, especially in southern herds. On the Angus cow, we just reckon it's a fantastic cross where you can combine the best of both breeds, and produce a real maternal machine," he said.

"I refer to the Simm/Angus cow as the first cross ewe of the beef industry - a real functional and maternal animal. You also get the benefits from the carcase, which, as a stud, we have placed a lot of emphasis on. You naturally get weight for age with the Simmie, as well as extra yield, and a bit of extra EMA size, which helps in these competitions."

Mr Cartledge said he had worked pretty hard within the Simmental breed as well as with the Angus genetics they'd brought in to achieve the carcase qualities, as well as other functional traits for the maternal side, like calving ease, type, softness, and doing ability.

"It's rewarding to see the results of what we've been trying to breed for, for many years, based off the work we've been putting in."

Mr Cartledge agreed it was a winning cross for them, as it excelled for both the cow calf producer as well as the feeder, and then the processor.

"I think it can do it all if you cross those two breeds and take the best out of them. It can be very functional and profitable across all segments of the industry."

Mr Cartledge said he had always been in Simmentals.

"When I was a kid, Dad ran a three-way crossbreeding program which included the

Simmental, and I've been home on the property for nearly 20 years now - that's roughly when we pushed into the Black Simmental, and started the stud operation.

We've been selling Black Simmental and Black Simmental/Angus-cross bulls, and until a couple of years ago, we had an annual auction. We now run a commercial herd which is predominantly SimAngus cows being mated to SimAngus bulls, which is what we previously marketed to our clients.

"We grow out our steers to heavy feedlot entry weights, and sell to a number of feedlots, including locally to Thomas Foods, Southern Cross Feedlot, JBS Tabbita in NSW, and Teys Charlton."

The Cartledges have also had success with their Black Simmental/Angus cattle at the Adelaide Show over many years, last year taking out the champion export carcase in the led steer competition, with their children, Harry, Lizzy, and Duncan all involved in showing steers.

"The year before we won grand champion steer on the Hook, and in 2021 we won champion eating quality - these steers were all grainfed."

Running their cattle operation in the upper south east of SA, not far from the Coorong, the Cartledges are doing it tough, seasonwise.

"It is pretty darn tough, really, as 2024 was the worst on record, and we've had just over two inches (50mm) of rain so far this year. I guess everyone has their turn, but it's gone from pretty bad to now

hoping that we get some kind of a growing season, because if we don't through spring, it's going to be another long summer and autumn," Mr Cartledge said.

"We have really healthy livestock country, with great drainage, and being so close to the coast, it's quite moderate weather, so I think that's a huge advantage. We have about a third of the property down to dryland lucerne, and our other predominant pasture species here is veldt grass. We don't actually do much cropping, but we do a little bit of oversowing to produce mainly silage."

Mr Cartledge said he loved the depth and thickness of the Simmental, as well as the yield, EMA, and weight for age, which were key traits.

"Obviously, they've got to meet the market specifications first and foremost, but I think that we get a big advantage having the two breeds in there. This is oversimplified, but we're getting eating quality from one side and meat yield from the other."

TULLAYR SIMMENTALS - YOUR BEEF IS OUR BUSINESS

Based just North of Scone in the Upper Hunter of NSW, Tullayr Simmentals owned and operated by the Wragge family for 25 years in 2026, was founded by George whilst in year 10 at school. Simmentals was landed on due to their maternal quiet disposition, high fertility, quick growth and balance between muscle and doing ability.

George recalls the old saying that you can have "milk without beef, but not beef without milk" and so the love of the breed grew rapidly.

With the love of cattle and showing cattle established whilst at school, George is passionate about the next generation and a big advocate for supporting the future generation. "Whilst at Uni, I was part of the founding committee who established the Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza. The show has close to 800 students attend from right across the country to participate in junior judging and parading, whist exhibiting around 400 steers and heifers". These days the stud often works with St Josephs Aberdeen to exhibit cattle at various shows across the country.

The studs breeding philosophy has always been focussed around the needs of the commercial cattle operation, that is, an animal must earn its place through fertility, be well natured and easy

doing, moderately framed and structurally sound from the hoof up. Some of the studs foundation females were sourced from Wondenia, Monried, Delelvin, Tennysonvale and Savannah Simmentals. Whilst traditional Simmentals are the focus, over the past decade, reds have been introduced in an attempt to moderate some cow lines, even out some pigmentation and soften up the calves. "We have a real focus on ensuring that our cattle can go into our clients herds and perform under various climatic conditions. QLD has been a real focus recently. we get a great deal of pleasure hearing of our cattle performing in such conditions, and in doing do validating our breeding objectives"

George believes a big part of the breeds success and growing interest in Northern Australia is in part due to the variability within the breed to be able to tailor a genetic package to a diverse range of operations, "When looking at our sale bulls we have a pretty good idea of where their markets are, we have had great success with our earlier maturing bulls in the Northern Rivers of NSW where the vealer calves are sought after, right through to the later maturing bulls with a little more leg under them being more suitable for the bullock operations of Western QLD" The stud has enjoyed good success through 3 major sales, that being, the Casino All Breeds Bull sale, the Queensland Simmental Bull Sale at Gracemere and the Ray White Barcaldine Bull Sale, Having 3 sales in 3 different locations assists the stud in geographical diversification but also climatical which is an important business decision for the stud.

A critical part of the studs success is being opportunistic

and dynamic when the opportunities present themselves and utilising technology readily available to them. "We have recently been fortunate enough to purchase what we believe as some pretty special females from both Jarravale and Wormbete studs in major reduction sales. It is not every day that the opportunity presents itself to buy right from the heart of a herd. Utilising IVF technology, Jarravale Lydia and Wormbete Mishka are on centre being flushed to assist in the genetic progress of such female lines". Using embryo transfer allows the stud land an extra 20-30 calves a year with genetic package sales a handy addition to that of the bull and female sales.

As the stud continues to look forward, George feels great about where the breed is headed. "We love being apart of the breed and have made some great friendships, swapping ideas, talking about animals, working together in times of hardship and showing with some healthy rivalry is all apart of what makes the breed special to the Wragge family, and seeing that come through in the next generation is particularly heartening and fulfilling".

2026 marks a milestone year for the stud with it celebrating 25 years of breeding, and in doing so will mark the celebration with a special offering. "A big part of my success has been the willingness of older breeders to assist me as a younger breeder, and as a way of giving back, we will open up the herd to a junior member to select a female of their choice to be flushed at our expense with that flush hopefully assisting that junior member in getting ahead in their program". Further details of this initiative to be released next year.

OPTIONS A PLENTY FOR WITHERS FAMILY

Simmentals are hitting a sweet spot for Lochaber North graziers Simon and Rachael Withers, who are selling their young cattle in the local and export markets.

The couple's 600-hectare property northwest of Naracoorte on South Australia's limestone coast supports 80-120 Simmental breeders each year depending on seasonal conditions. They also run 500 White Suffolk and Ile De France stud ewes and a 1000-head of commercial Merino and first cross ewe flock for prime lamb and wool production.

Cattle have long been in the blood for the family, with Mr Wither's grandfather being a foundation breeder of Simmentals and Shorthorns in South Australia.

His uncle, Phil Withers is still running Simmental (previously Nalpa Stud) and Shorthorn cattle at the historic family property Nalpa station near Wellington.

He chose commercial Simmentals because they are highly productive in the local environmental and seasonal conditions. "They are very fertile, with a noticeable increase in twinning rates in our herd in recent years, and excellent milkers," he said.

"Because they achieve such good growth rates and milk production, they make fabulous mothers and that means the whole herd is high-performing."

The Withers source their Simmental genetics from the Yerwal Estate stud at Lucindale, where they also source a few Angus sires to mate to maiden heifers for ease of first calving.

Mr Withers also works off-farm, so his system is set up for joining cattle in May to calve during the following February, with maidens calving at 20-22-months-old.

In the past, the Withers have targeted the Naracoorte weaner sales in January-February as their main market for grass fed progeny.

These calves are weaned into purpose built weaning pens for two weeks, where they receive hay and silage and are turned off at weights of about 380-450kgs depending on season at 9-10 months old.

In recent years, they have started to sell these direct off farm to feedlots at Wentworth in NSW, who target these weights and sell on to Coles.

The Withers also select lines of weaner heifers to sell via live export into a lucrative Chinese breeding program coordinated through Australian-owned exporting company Austrex.

For several years, they have supplied this market with young female stock at minimum weights of 250 to 300kg, which is typically reached at about 8-9-months-old.

To meet Chinese protocols, the heifers must be purchased on-farm and be from a Bluetongue virus-



free zone. There are often premiums paid for these heifers that the family is not retaining as breeders.

In some years, lighter weight heifers have commanded values equal to what they would have got at heavier weights six months down the track if carried through winter. Mr Withers said the Chinese particularly liked purebred Simmental females.

"They are seeking the more traditional type of Simmental markings, and they prefer the reds whether that is cherry red or the more apricot tones," he said.

'It is good to have a diverse range of markets."

For heifers, not being sent to China, but retained in the breeding herd, the Withers mate these to Angus sires in their first year, then Simmentals for the remainder of their life, focusing on early growth, ease of calving, fat content, milk production and poll genes.

Mr Withers said fat and growth traits were key, as heifers are mated at 13 months of age. "We want to breed top quality females, as they are the engine of the herd," he said.

"If they have the right muscle and fat distribution, they will produce more milk and progeny that will perform well to optimise our whole-farm productivity.

"A lot of our decision-making about bulls comes down to visual inspection of softness across the frame, muscle definition, dark colour and panda-type eye markings."

To ensure returns per hectare are maximised, the Withers have been undertaking pasture improvements to boost the feed base across their property. They have been spreading



clay for the past six years to help ameliorate the constraints associated with sandy soils that are typical of the Limestone Coast region.

"These areas fill an important summer and autumn feed gap and as well as excellent finishing pasture for weaners and lambs "Mr Withers said.

As more areas are refurbished with better quality feed, the Withers plan to boost stock numbers and hold steers to sell at heavier weights.

This year has seen some of the best and worst of Qld's weather and throughout all these challenges Qld breeders have shone bright once again in the Show Ring and Sale Yards. Queensland has had an encouraging surge in popularity with many crossbreeding operations having snapped up sires from the many Queensland Simmental sales. These producers are looking for Simmental Sires to improve their overall production, yields, temperament and milk.

There have been some outstanding results from Queensland Studs in the sale ring. Elite Cattle Co setting a new Black Simmental Top Price of \$67500, with Elite Uproar, who won the Urquhart Trophy for the Supreme Beef Exhibit at this year's Sydney Royal Show. Karragarra Simmentals, Emerald with 100% clearance of 105 bulls (single vendor) with both Traditional and Black Bulls. Some of the Qld sale results are as follows; (if I miss any please forgive me).

Ag Grow Elite Bull Sale Emerald- Simmentals 16/16 with a top of \$46,000

Qld Simmental Bull Sale 28th July - Sold 96/96, top of \$22,000, average \$9572.92

Lucrana Simmental – sold 68/68, top of \$30,000, average \$12176.

POWERHOUSE FEMALES AT MONSILDALE

The success of breeding highly functional, fertile and productive cattle that suit a range of markets across commercial and stud operations has been put down to the maternal traits of the Simmental female and the impact they have on any purebred or crossbred herds.

Toogoolawah based Simmental and Simbrah commercial and stud breeders Jack and Megan Fogg have backed the Simmental as a "Powerhouse" in their cattle operation for milk and fertility and believe the breed is the base to the success they are achieving.

The Fogg's run approximately 170 breeding females and replacement heifers across 1200 hectares of family property at Monsildale, and a further 20 select stud females near Toogoolawah in SE Qld.

The main breeder block at Monsildale is hilly, lighter forest country with native cooch and spear grass pastures predominating. Herd sires cover this country well with a single sire joined in each mob, while a small number of select stud Simmental females at their home block are joined to Al sires.

They follow a 3-month joining regime that aligns with calving during their pasture growing period, with bulls typically going out from November to early February and calves being born from late August to November.

Mrs Fogg said their maiden heifers were typically joined at around two years of age to calve as rising three-year-olds. We find this works best in our programme as they are well grown, able to maintain themselves and a calf, and re-breed successfully without any special attention or extra inputs from a management perspective.

"We have used Simmentals commercially for more than 30 years but directed our breeding program more towards the Simbrah females over the past 20 years due to the greater parasite resistance from the **Brahman influence.**"

She said registered Simmental and Simbrah bulls had been the sole sires used over the past 10 years, giving them a far more consistent line of quality females.

Megan's mother, Diane, also ran a Simmental stud (Duck Creek) from the early 1980's and when she retired from the cattle her remaining purebred females were incorporated into the Koonaworra stud

In more recent years they have purchased additional stud females from Tennysonvale, Daraabah, Wormbete & Meldon Park Stud's to increase their core stud Simmental breeder herd.

The Fogg's target their steers to turn off as 6-8 month old weaners, generally 250-350kg, into the backgrounder market, selling through their local Toogoolawah weaner sales.

Mrs Fogg said the past few years their weaner steers had been highly sought after with many repeat buyers competing on them and gaining some fantastic returns, particularly for their young age.

"In a Charolais-dominated area it is pleasing to see our Simmentals consistently up there with the top priced pens," she said.

"From the heifer portion we select sufficient replacement females for our operation and then either background the remaining ones until heavy enough to feedlot for the domestic trade, or we may offer the higher quality excess females to market as potential breeding females to commercial operations."

Mrs Fogg said they choose Simmentals as they have proven themselves to be efficient, productive, highly



fertile cattle that can handle their lighter country with ease. They consistently show quiet temperaments, fantastic mothering abilities and turn off quality, heavy weaners at 6-8mths of age.

"Our cattle operation is run alongside our many other work and family commitments, so we also value their ability to calve easily without constant monitoring."

"The Simmental cow is a powerhouse of milk and fertility. They are extremely good mothers and highly protective of their calves from wild dog predation, which is a significant issue in our area."

"The milk they put into their calves gives our weaners an edge above others as they are consistently bloomy at weaning time, yet despite their high milk yield the cows are still highly fertile and often will calve well inside the expected 12-month window, on average seasonal conditions."

"The high growth rate of calves means we are able to wean a bit younger and still have the weight at weaning, but it also allows the cow to have a welldeserved break to look after herself and the next developing progeny," she said.

Mrs Fogg said they find the Simmentals to be far superior on mothering ability, milk yield, longevity,



temperament and structure, when these traits are carefully selected for over continuous generations.

"All these traits are highly valued in our production system. Simmentals also seem to cross phenomenally well with any other breed which we feel gives them a significant commercial advantage," she said.

At this year's Toogoolawah Weaner Show and Sale the Fogg family won the Best Pen of Simmental/ Simbrah infused steers and had the second top priced pen of the sale at \$1590/hd, in a total yarding of 5347 head.

This year they entered a pen of weaner age Simbrah heifers into the special class - Pen of Replacement Females at the Toogoolawah show where they were judged against many quality joining age females of various breeds and to their delight they won the class against solid competition, having consistently gained placings in this class over previous years.

The Fogg's believe the ability for the Simmental to breed and mother a highly productive calf at a young age with such growth and carcase sets them apart at the weaner sales and drives the demand for their cattle.



FILLING THE HR GAP FOR FARMERS

Human resources is a forgotten word across Australian farming businesses and the day to day activities on farms, until an issue arises and the knowledge gap and understanding by employers is really uncovered.

Farm businesses manage staff across a multitude of ages, skill sets, a range of operations and requirements and as work increases, multi languages and cultures.

The need for strong HR structure and practices on farm has never been more evident than in today's farming landscape.

Liz Thorby, a 38-year Human Resources veteran not only lives and helps run their own cattle property at Dingo in Central Queensland but has worked across some of the countries largest corporate businesses like Anglo America, Rio Tinto and Qantas.

Liz understands rural and regional farming businesses like theirs and has identified a gap in the knowledge and skill set of farm owners and managers to not only set up correct structures and procedures on farm, but how to have the conversations to deal confidently with issues as they arise.

"The employment regulatory environment has changed, and employers often don't know what they don't know and because of this farming businesses can expose themselves to litigation and issues they didn't even realise existed."

She said working and living isolated on farms is no longer a protection, as good HR practices are required in all workplaces, including the bush. The internet has brought information about employment standards and rights to the country for employees, so the information is out there.

Ms Thorby believes that farmers who have been affected by the labour shortages may be turning a blind eye to improving management practices and addressing people issues such as performance management, due to the risk of losing valuable staff.

Ms Thorby said there is also a lot of uncertainty around what employers can and can't do and this may also be a factor in being reluctant to deal with issues when they arise, or even taking the time to set up effective work practices, which exposes their businesses, and this is a bit of a wave that is happening.

"Farm businesses are really exposed at the moment and do need to set up backend structures and inform and upskill their managers about the employment side of their business. This helps leaders and owners support their decisions and confidently answer questions or challenges from employees. "

If an employee does commence a legal claim, there is a reverse onus of proof on employers to show why they have made some employment decisions, so employers need to be informed about what they are and be prepared with good quality record keeping and other acceptable forms of evidence.

"In today's day and age, it feels like the employer has more accountabilities and all the rights are with the employee, but that can be rectified with better structure and governance in your business to protect yourself and show the preparation leaders and owners have taken to get their decision right, before speaking to employees. "she said

Drawing on decades of experience in both agriculture and human resources Liz Thorby founded her new business Rural HR to support employers in the bush, and she combines industry knowledge with proven HR expertise to deliver solutions that truly fit your on farm business.

"To manage performance well and set yourself up as a good place to work, it's important to communicate your expectations about meeting the goals of the business and the role each person plays in the team to get this work done. "

"How we can help is to help you define your performance goals, standards of work and skill levels that are required, and track the progress of your employees."

"Underperformance and misconduct can be addressed more effectively when measured against clear objectives and expectations and this is something that is rarely documented or discussed in farming enterprises," she said.

Ms Thorby works across the feedlot sector, large scale beef operations and small family-owned operations that employ staff, whether it be full time,

casual or seasonal, and applies the same principles to support the employer.

"I am all about the employer and making sure they are aware of their rights and want to support them in setting up their structures to allow them to be safe and successful within their own business, and when the going gets tough, have access to specialist employment lawyers".

She said that she believes there is a gap within farming and rural businesses understanding legislation or government regulations and employers are at risk of falling foul of the employment environment, because they don't have strong governance behind them to support and back up their business.

"There is a real need for employer support on farm and with my corporate knowledge and understanding of how a working farm operation works, I believe I have the ability to make many farming businesses more secure and safe when it comes to staff and on farm issues," she said.

"If you want to be a good employer this means you are interested in having satisfied and engaged workers and your workplace is a good environment for people. This means the leader or owner must be an authentic communicator and have processes in place that allow you as an employer

and your employees to be crystal clear on roles, responsibilities and expectations to be able to address performance and issues as they arise and not let them fester," she said.

To improve leader confidence speaking directly with staff about employment matters, Liz said she works with business owners to practice their communication style, answer questions calmly in the moment and keep their cool. She supports leaders and business owners build on their own natural communication style, which helps maintain authentic trusted relationships with employees.

Ms Thorby said that employers and employees should feel good about having good HR practices as it takes any guess work out and enables them to be on the same page and work effectively.

Ms Thorby said at the end of the day, what you want from your employee is that extra discretionary effort – engaged, observant, make them feel like they are part of the business, give them recognition for the work they do in their role, and talk about future opportunities and your staff will stay a lot longer and be happier.

Rural HR has just launched their new website Ruralhr.com.au and is keen to grow and support farming businesses to have greater structure and feel supported in their day to day operation.

BACKGROUNDING OFF GRASS IN PASTORAL COUNTRY

Simmental cattle are performing extremely well off grass as a backgrounding option in the pastoral country to the feedlots for Dunkeld beef producer Adam Black.

The Black's run a 600 cow beef operation between Mitchell and St George in South Western Queensland, after a move from a predominantly Brahman based crossbred operation in Nebo in Central Queensland five years ago.

The operation spans 30,300 acres and is all pastoral country, with a focus on backgrounding the progeny for the feedlots of Teys Australia and JBS.

The older base cows still reflect the crossbred Brahman base, but the transition to a full Simmental base herd is well underway and you can start to see the significant shift in the breeding herd.

Mr Black said they had used Simmentals for the last 10 to 12 years and had significantly ramped up only using Simmental bulls in the last five years.

"We also run goats and sheep on our property in a mixed farming operation and that mix works well for us."

The Black family target the feedlots with their calves, aiming for the 450 to 480 kilogram entry weight into Teys and JBS at approximately 18 months of age solely off grass.

"Our cattle need to have growth, fat cover and fertility to enable us to get a live calf on the ground, hit the specs more frequently at younger ages and fat cover is one of the key attributes we select for in our bulls to help us finish our cattle quicker."

We source our bulls from Woonallee, Casa Toro, Fairview and Lucrana, chasing traditional and Black Simmental bulls, with an aim to join our heifers to the black bulls for better calving ease, while the cow herd sees more of the traditional bulls for growth and carcase.

"We have found that by using the Black Simmental bulls over our heifers has been a plus for us, as they add that little bit extra comfort with calving ease the first time around."

"The Simmental cow is the best mother we have seen with their tremendous milk and the ability to get a calf up and going really fast, allowing us to hit markets at younger ages."

In the pastoral country the cows need to be able to calve easily and unassisted, with the ability to look after that calf and give it the best start to life and Simmentals do just that.

"Not only do they calve easily and offer great milk, maternally they are a standout in the way they mother and look after their calves."

Their focus is to get as much data behind their cattle as they can when selecting bulls and then back that up with structure and an eye test to make sure they are fit for purpose in their Western country.

"They need to be able to walk, they need to look like bulls, and they must have data that shows us they can perform and help us tighten the process of breeding a strong line of calves that are attractive to feedlots."

"The thing about Simmentals that we find over other breeds is that they just keep growing, making them so much easier to market across multiple weight ranges, specifications, markets and geographies."

We have found through our move South that the more European content from the Simmental in our cattle, attracts a lot more buyers and opportunities, through their carcase, weight and finishing ability.

The Black's brand 500 calves a year, offering large lines of backgrounder steers and heifers to the feedlots.

We have a Christmas meeting planed for later in the year.


I would like to sincerely thank Federal council, the WA committee and members for their continued hard work and dedication to our wonderful breed

ALAN ANDERSON - LIFE MEMBERSHIP

35 Years dedicated to the breed

A dedication to the Simmental breed for 35 years started in 1990 when Alan Anderson, Wendouree Simmentals, Cobbitty, secured his first Simmental bull in Dubbo to put over Hereford cows.

The love for the breed evolved and he bought his first bull to start his stud from Duncan Young and over the years received a lot of help and support from his great friend and the late Bill Almond.

Alan sold his place in Dubbo and bought his beloved farm at Crookwell over 30 years ago, where they built up to a 60-cow registered stud herd between there and Cobbitty.

Mr Anderson got involved in the Southern Highlands Simmental group early on, which evolved into nearly 20 years on committees and council and an eightyear tenure on the Simmental federal council.

Through his time on the board and in the breed, he was fortunate enough to travel with congresses and personal trips to Ireland, Scotland, New Zealand, England, Austria, Germany, Switzerland and his favourite was Namibia in Africa, which he found extremely interesting.

His biggest highlight was the World Congress in Australia and showcasing the Australian Simmentals to his friends across the world.

His love affair with the breed hit a highlight in 2004. where he took a 15-month-old bull to Sydney Royal, weighing 806 kilograms and went on to take out the Supreme Exhibit of that years Sydney Royal.

He remembers vividly, he and his wife Marjorie, walking out of the gates at Sydney showgrounds ringing the bell on the trophy they had just won as a moment in time he will never forget.

Mr Anderson said they had made some wonderful friends in the breed and remembers the time they flew into Western Australia and his great friends Audrey and David Weightman handed him the keys to her Mercedes and simply said drop it back to Perth in 10 days, enjoy your trip and he thought at that point, we really do have some great friends in this breed.

Mr Anderson has built his Simmental life around encouraging young people to get into the breed and the cattle industry and was a big part of Stuart Moeck at Valley Creek Simmentals securing his

first Simmental cow as a 16 year old and now going on to be very successful in his own right with wife Samantha.

Mr Anderson works closely with Macarthur Anglican School at Cobbitty and has supplied them Simmental steers to attend Sydney Royal for many years.

"It is truly a great thing to help and encourage these young kids and it really fills my heart with joy."

Mr Anderson said there were three things that gave him the most satisfaction through his 35 years in the Simmental breed, he loved his cattle, he loved to help people, and he loved to encourage the young kids to get involved and love the cattle as much as he did.

On reflection on his time in the breed, 87-year-old Mr Anderson, said the biggest challenge we faced was acceptance of the breed, which he believed they had achieved over time.

"Our biggest achievement on the board was bringing the breed back from the American style of animal and put some size and body back in the cattle," he said.

"The breed promotes itself; they have some many tremendous attributes that benefit the Australian beef industry and commercial producers are really starting to see that now," he said.

When asked about the characters he met over his journey, Mr Anderson said there was this one bloke that he spent a lot of time with and truly respected even though he used top rib me a lot of the time and that was the late great John Horne, who was a big advocate of our breed and a really close friend to me.

Belief in the black revolution

For close to 40 years Mike Frankcombe, Slopes Simmentals, West Kentish, Tasmania, has been flying the Simmental flag for Tasmania and at the recent Melbourne Royal show he was awarded a life membership to Simmental Australia.

Mike was a pioneer in the development of the SimAngus register during his 15 years on the Simmental Australia board.

Mike remembers the many hours both he and Charles Cowcher with the support of Peter Speers spent developing the SimAngus register and developing the transition to offer members a Black option with hybrid vigour.

"That was one of my greatest achievements in the breed and my time on the board, I feel we left a great legacy that is now starting to reap a lot of rewards for the breed," he said.

Mike with his son Scott and his family run the Slopes Simmental stud in West Kentish near Sheffield in Tasmania, where they at one point ran 70 registered cows, of which they are now back to 30 stud cows and hold a small online helmsman bull sale every year selling approximately 15 bulls.

Mike was a third-generation dairy farmer that was convinced by his brother in law to try a Simmental bull over their Friesians back in the day to produce vealers for the butcher trade.

His love for the breed grew due to their great milk and ability to get calves to 400 to 450 kilograms at 10 months of age.

"The butchers absolutely loved them, they had great shape and weight with very little wastage for cattle for that age," he said.

Mike started his stud herd in 1986 after leaving the dairy game but developed a love for the Simmental breed and pioneered change in the breed through the

transition to SimAngus.

He was on the board for 15 years over two stints and remembers vividly the changes initially in developing the rules and regulations and then rescuing the breed from the huge frame score cattle that could have cruelled the breed in the day, before seeing the moderation of today's Simmental and SimAngus cattle that are now heavily sought after across the country.

"The Angus breed had a huge gene pool and some really great genetics, so to tap into that and produce SimAngus cattle with hybrid vigour and a new option for Simmental producers, really was a special time, "he said.

Mike said he was pretty lucky when he was on the board, as there where limited Simmental members in Tasmania to put pressure on him to vote their way, which made his time on the board enjoyable as he had the ability to make decisions without being swayed.

"I was always glad I could vote for what was in the best interest of the breed at all times."

Mike has handed the reins to his son Scott and his wife Anita and their son Ethan and intends to get out and have a few holidays while he still can and go and see a bit of the world with his new partner Angela.

What is the strangest thing you have ever eaten?



BREWER BEEF MAKE HISTORY IN BEEF SPECTACULAR TRIAL

For the first time in the Beef Spectacular Feedback Trial's history, a team has scored full points for feedlot performance.

Producers Tara and David Brewer, Brewer Beef, Tallangatta Valley, Vic, claimed champion feedlot performance with a full score of 350 points.

Their team of black Simmental/Angus steers also finished fifth overall with 781 points out of a possible 1000.

The five steers recorded a daily average weight gain ranging from 2.40 kilograms to a top of 2.53kg.

David Brewer said the steers entered into the trial were generally the later drop calves in the program with a higher percentage of Simmental content.

"It's better to know where the bottom is at than the top," he said.

"The trial is a good benchmark to compare yourself to what the top-end producers are doing.

"We get a lot of feedback on our client's calves, which are generally out of pure Angus cows, so this trial is a way for us to bench more of the higher Simmental content calves."

After making some changes to sire selection based on previous trial results, Mr Brewer said the operation had seen a large change in the fat cover of its bulls.

The main market for the operations' steers and most of their clients is the grass-fed market. The trial then allows the family to see the results of their steers in a grain-fed scenario.

"We can particularly see the improvement with our seed stock breeding this year when we scanned all our bulls," Mr Brewer said.

"With that, we seen our fats and our marble scores have increased pretty dramatically.

"Our coverage on our bulls this year is almost double what we normally have, and that's due to an introduction of new bulls to the program."

Mr Brewer said the family had been purchasing older proven Angus sires to introduce to the program, which has been the biggest influence within the herd.

He said choosing the older proven bulls allowed a sustainable and reliable data baseline for their breeding program.

"If I see a bull that's proven and he has daughters calving and everything good, to me that's a better way to go," Mr Brewer said.

"Because your most profitable cows are cows that last in the herd.

"We also look for the history in the cows side in their fertility and production."

Longevity and temperament were also key qualities the family focused on within their females.

TRADITION TO TRANSITION AT HOLBROOK

A love for traditional characteristics, traits and performance has evolved to trend and transition as the demand for black cattle continues to drive demand for Holbrook beef produces Russell and Lea Parker.

A traditional herd started over 50 years ago by his father and still holds an extremely big place in the heart of Mr Parker, remains the base line for his breeding philosophy.

The Parkers run just short of 800 hectares, running 400 breeders that are now a black Simmental and Angus cross herd, with an emphasis on hybrid vigour and cattle that are moderate and efficient, but perform extremely well-off grass and have the ability to hit markets and specs for the feedlots at the same time.

"We calve down 400 calves a year, with 80 to 100 heifers retained in the herd, 100 heifers grown out to be sold at saleable weight and 200 steers that are targeted for the feedlots at 12 to 13 months of age."

The Parker's started with a traditional Simmental herd for many years and have slowly transitioned to a black Simmental and Angus base herd to meet market demands.

Mr Parker said the black cattle are progressing in genetic improvement, but for me the traditional Simmental was still the standout maternal female in the beef industry, they are great mothers and a true dual-purpose female that offers maternal, milk and meat at the same time.

"We have adapted our female herd over the years and now criss-cross our 5/8 black Simmental females with an Angus bull and black Simmental bulls with 5/8 Angus cows.

"The maternal traits of the Simmental breed are our key profit drivers on farm, and we put it down to four key attributes in Meat, Marbling, Maternal Milk which results in Money made."

Mr Parker said the "Cow" was the most important part of his farming enterprise and they must be sound, fertile and efficient, moderate frame size with length and depth with the ability to raise a calf every year.







The SimAngus cows we breed are basically a "Supercharged Angus", as they offer effectively the same characteristics phenotypically to an Angus, but the free hit in hybrid vigour far outweighs what you get from a straight Angus cow.

Cast for age cows are a large part of our income so a high yielding well-muscled cow is desirable



provided she has raised a calf every year and done so efficiently.

"The Simmental/Angus cows strike the balance for us between milk, muscle and yield of the Simmental, while keeping the carcase traits of the Angus."

"The two breeds compliment each other so well and I know it is working for us, as we get calves that

grow faster and are more profitable and every cross breeder is aware of this," he said.

Mr Parker said he is in the business to breed beef but is mindful to breed cattle that create a good dining experience and this remains one of the main reasons he continues to use Simmentals as his base.

"I get paid on the more kilograms of beef I produce per hectare and even with the slight decrease we get in cents/kg for not being Angus, we pick that up and more with the hybrid vigour hit we get from the crossbred Simmentals," he said.

"We calve in July and August and the calves we raise are continually doing 2 -2.5kg per day off grass and the Simmental/Angus steers we have fed in the past, side by side with Angus steers have seen our steers producing 0.5 to 1kg per day more than the Angus under the same conditions, yet yielding from 56-58% while the Angus only achieving 52-53%," he said.

Mr Parker said they were big on crossbreeding and getting the hybrid vigour advantage from the cross, but it was the maternal traits of the Simmental that really set up their program to be successful.


The line up of Simmentals steers at Sydney this year were a great representation of the breed and certainly didn't look out of place.

STAYABILITY EPD DOES IT WORK?

Most breeders understand that Stayability predicts differences in the ability of an animal's daughters to remain productive in the herd, calving every year, to six years of age. Stayability EPD's are reported in percentages; higher is better.

However, many breeders aren't aware that Stayability is measured once a female (daughter) first calves at 2 years and then calves again at 3 years old. This means that culling heifers prior to joining or joining a high percentage of the herds heifers and culling as first calvers does not affect the calculation. By far the largest percentage of females normally culled in the window of 3 to 6 years old is fertility, meaning that Stayability works well as a measure of female fertility.

Daughters sired by bulls in the top 25 percent for Stayability were over twice as likely to remain in the herd as six-year-old cows and averaged almost two more calves in their lifetime compared to daughters sired by bulls in the bottom 25 percent for Stayability EPD.


The financial success of cow-calf operations depends on a cow's ability to remain in the herd long enough to recoup the cost of heifer development and cow maintenance. In order to achieve this, a heifer needs to calve as a 2-year-old and produce a calf each subsequent year. Stayability EPD was developed to predict this reproductive success (or failure) and is defined as a cow's ability to remain in the herd to a specific endpoint, with the assumption that open cows are culled. The typical endpoint is defined at six years of age. Stayability has an economic influence on a cow herd through female reproduction, increased calves per cow, and increased calf performance, given mature cows on average wean heavier calves.

As with most reproductive traits, the heritability of Stayability is low (less than 0.20) indicating a large non-genetic influence on Stayability. These nongenetic influences can range from environmental to management and are not inherited by future progeny. On the flip side, if you provide the optimal environment for your herd, but lack the genetics for cow longevity, you will still find yourself with cows falling out of the herd prematurely. Although a low heritability for Stayability illustrates the importance and significance of management,

it also tells us that there is an underlying genetic aspect to a cow's ability to remain in the herd. Furthermore, since cow longevity is largely determined by the environment, making genetic selections to improve longevity is far more accurate with a Stayability EPD compared to visual selection for a phenotype heavily influenced by the environment. In the context of genetic improvement, ignoring Stayability EPD can slow or reverse the genetic progress for this highly relevant trait.

Since its development, the Stayability EPD has been published by multiple breed associations, but how reliable is this EPD for predicting cow longevity?


To examine this question, over 140,000 daughters from high-accuracy bulls for Stayability from the IGS database were analysed. These sires were ranked by their Stayability EPD and divided into four percentile groups (or quartiles; 1–25 [top or best], 26–50, 51–74, 75–99 [bottom or worst] percentile). Within each quartile, the percentage of daughters remaining in the herd to six years of age and the average number of calves from daughters in their lifetime was compared.



As you can see in the graph, as Stayability EPD increased, the percentage of daughters reaching the age of six also increased. When comparing the lowest quartile to the highest quartile, the percentage of daughters remaining in the herd to age six more than doubled.

Only 22% of the daughters reached the age of six for the lowest quartile, compared to 49% of daughters for sires in the highest quartile.

But how does this translate to calves on the ground?




The second graph illustrates the average number of calves from daughters of sires within each Stayability

EPD quartile group. There is a clear increase in the average number of calves per cow as we move toward the top percentile. Daughters from sires in the top Stayability quartile averaged nearly two more calves in their lifetime compared to daughters out of sires in the lowest Stayability quartile.

Female longevity is one of the most economically impactful traits of commercial cow-calf operations. When choosing genetics for replacement females, emphasizing Stayability will optimize the genetic potential for longevity in the herd.





- A major role for the Simmental breed is its use in crossbreeding programs.
- Simmental x British or Bos Indicus calves gain weight 10% to 20% faster, reaching market weight younger and earlier, reducing annual stocking pressure.
- Crossbreeding with Simmental produces significant productivity gains due to hybrid vigour and to the additive traits derived from the Simmental breed.
- When combined, these gains generally boost overall productivity by 10% to 20% in the Simbeef F1 (first cross)

- animal and by 20% to 25% where the Simbeef F1 female is used as a breeder.
- Simmentals may be used in either "Terminal" or "Rotational" crossbreeding programs.
- Crossbred cows stay in the herd 3.1 years longer and produce 20% more weaning weight over the lifetime of the cow than their straight bred counterparts. Source USDA Mark.
- Simmental composites simplify crossbreeding, maintain uniformity and achieve optimum levels of heterosis.





HOOF & HOOK RESULTS

SHEFFIELD 2024

Simmentals achieved great success in the 2024 Sheffield Hoof and Hook competition. held November and December 2024. One of only two carcase competitions still remaining in Tasmania, the quality and quantity of cattle is always extremely strong!

Simmentals were represented in the heavyweight section of the competition (held November) with a class of 16 heavyweights on the hoof. Of the 4 Simmental cattle in the led class, three of these were pulled forward into 3rd, 4th and 5th place respectively (these steers were all exhibited by Chelsea Rayner of the Kidman Downs stud).

In December the hook section of the competition took place with some fantastic points and scoring for Simmental carcasses. In the heavyweight section, Taz Phoenix (exhibited by Ethan Frankcombe of Taz Simmentals) took out Champion Heavyweight Carcase on a total point score of 90.96. In the same class, Kidman Downs Universe placed 3rd on a total point score of 84.99. Taz Phoenix then continued his stellar run with the Reserve Grand Champion Carcase of the Show (0.4 points behind the winner) and was also awarded the highest scoring Simmental or Simmental x carcase of the show (\$200 donated by the Tasmanian Simmental branch).

IGS - \$GAIN & DMI

International Genetic Solutions have officially released the \$Gain economic subindex, as well as the Dry Matter Intake (DMI) Expected Progeny Difference (EPD).

The purpose of these traits is to help breeders better characterise terminal performance by evaluating genetic differences for feed intake and the profitability potential associated with growth relative to intake.

Feed efficiency is gathering momentum as a selection tool to help the beef industry to achieve greater levels of efficiency in feeder cattle.

Dry matter (DM) refers to the portion of feed remaining after all moisture has been removed. This includes carbohydrates, proteins, fats, vitamins, and minerals that provide energy and building blocks for the animal's body. Animals require a steady supply of nutrients for daily functions, including growth and reproduction. Livestock producers and animal nutritionists focus on how much actual nutrient-dense material an animal consumes. This measurement is known as Dry Matter Intake, or DMI. DMI helps accurately assess nutrient consumption.

The Dry Matter Intake (DMI) EPD is expressed as the difference in pounds of daily dry matter intake. A lower EPD may be more desirable, as this is representative of the genetic potential for progeny to consume less feed. For example:

- Bull A = 1.00 DMI EPD.
- Bull B = 0.00 DMI EPD.

You would expect progeny from Bull B to eat 1 pound less daily dry matter of feed compared to progeny from Bull A.

Feed costs are one of the largest costs for beef producers and have a significant impact on the

profitability of beef production systems. Being able to identify animals that convert feed more efficiently is an important tool for cattle breeders to increase production efficiency.

Despite this, producers should exercise caution when making genetic selections based solely on DMI reduction. Studies have shown there is a high genetic correlation between DMI and Average Daily Gain (ADG), meaning that sole selection for reduced intake can inadvertently lead to slower-growing, smaller framed cattle.

\$Gain however, balances both the economic component of average daily gain (ADG) and DMI, ensuring that the most profitable animals are identified. Cattle that eat less but also grow less are not necessarily more desirable, meaning that selection on biological efficiency does not always equate to profitability, thus the recommendation for producers is to consider placing emphasis on \$Gain in your selection decisions.

\$Gain balances both growth and intake to identify cattle that convert dry matter intake into kilograms of beef more efficiently.

\$Gain is a sub-index and is expressed as the difference in daily profitability of animals in the feedlot based on the combination of DMI and ADG (Average Daily Gain) EPD. ADG is positively weighted by the value of a pound of gain, and DMI is negatively weighted by the cost of a pound of dry matter.

Higher \$Gain values are more desirable. For example:

- Bull A = \$0.10 subindex value.
- Bull B = \$0.00 subindex value.

You would expect progeny from Bull A to be \$0.10 more profitable per day than progeny from Bull B due to a combination of feed requirements and growth potential.



UNDERSTANDING IGS ACCURACIES

One of the more confusing elements of IGS EPD's has been the change in the way that accuracies are reported.

Published accuracy values are generally numerically lower in the IGS EPD system, and they will be considerably lower for non-parent animals.

An erroneous conclusion would be that IGS EPDs are less informative than our previous EBVs. Rather, the reduction in published accuracy is due to IGS accuracy being presented on a different scale.

Think of it as the difference between Celsius and Fahrenheit. 20 degrees Celsius and 68 degrees Fahrenheit are quite different numbers. 68 degrees definitely sounds warmer than 20 degrees, but they are the same temperature, simply different methods of calculating the same thing.

UNDERSTANDING POSSIBLE CHANGE

Possible change represents the amount of change that can be expected for the EBV or EPD as new information becomes available.

Since EBV's and EPD's are predictions, not true values, we can expect that they will change as more information is collected (genomics, progeny data, etc..).

Accuracy is an indicator of the risk of possible change for the EBV or EPD. Higher accuracy predictions generally have less potential for possible change than lower accuracy predictions. At any given accuracy though, the prediction still represents the best estimate of the animals true genetic merit, based on available data, and should not be discounted because of the calculated accuracy value.

IGS currently uses the BIF calculation to report accuracy.

BIF ACCURACY

IGS uses what has been dubbed BIF (Beef Improvement Federation) accuracy. Just as it would be trivial to publish Fahrenheit in Celsius, we could certainly publish accuracy on the same scale we used in the past (traditional accuracy).

WHY DO IGS PUBLISH BIF ACCURACY?

EBVs and EPDs are predictions but we can expect that they will move toward true genetic merit values as more information is collected

(genomics, progeny data, etc.). In the field of statistics, possible change (PC) is the standard for expressing how much confidence we should have that a prediction (EPD, EBV) is close to its true value. It does this by providing an estimate of the range +-, the prediction that we can expect the true value to fall into 2/3 of the time.

The appeal of BIF accuracy is that, unlike traditional accuracy, it has a linear relationship with PC (see graph). Therefore, for every percent increase in BIF accuracy, there is an equal percentage decrease in PC. This makes BIF more intuitive than our previous accuracy.



Table 1 demonstrates the relationship between possible change and traditional and BIF accuracy calculations using a genetic variance of 100.

As the table shows, as BIF accuracy increases by 10%, there is a corresponding decrease in possible change of 10%.

The table also gives a guide to the relationship between traditional accuracy and BIF accuracy at different levels. A non-parent animal with a BIF accuracy of 0.2 (20%) is equivalent to a traditional accuracy of 0.6 (60%) in this table.

The important thing to remember is that although accuracies are lower than traditional accuracies, it doesn't mean that the EPD value is less accurate, just that the calculation has changed. It also doesn't suggest that one calculation is "good" and the other "bad", they are just two different ways of solving the same problem.

ACCURACY AND POSSIBLE CHANGE


Every EPD is presented with an associated accuracy value. Accuracy values reflect the amount of information available on the animal and it relatives for use in genetic evaluation. As we obtain and use more information in evaluating an animal's genetic merit, the accuracy value will increase. Accuracy values can range from 0.00 and 1.00 with a higher value representing greater accuracy.

Because accuracy indicates available information, they are extremely valuable as a risk management tool. The higher the accuracy the more certain we are of an animal's genetic merit and thus, the less risk there is in using the animal. The table shows the possible change (plus or minus) in the EPD of an animal, based on its' accuracy. Any EPD changes are expected to fall within this range (EPD plus and minus the possible change) 95% of the time.

THE HIDDEN VALUES OF GENOMICS

Genomics has been an active contributor to the performance of Australian beef herds for longer than many realise.

Qualitative traits, which usually rely on a simple inheritance pattern, such as polledness, coat colour and some genetic defects have been measured using genomics for many years.

Parentage too, using limited markers, has also been in use for years. Ensuring accurate pedigrees has a large effect on the accuracy of genetic evaluations.

While these might seem small, they are an important use of genomics. Many producers now look for homo polled bulls for example. Because the polled gene is dominant and the horn gene recessive, progeny of homo polled bulls (ie; have no horned gene), can only produce polled calves. By identifying the polled status of cattle, genomics allow breeders to manage polledness with ease.

The same is also true of many genetic defects meaning they will only express the defect if they have two copies of the defect genes. Genomics has been instrumental in identifying the status of animals for key genetic defects.

In this way, genomics has been a successful management tool for breeders for some time. Now, genomics has expanded further to become a critical platform for genetic evaluations.

Traditional genetic evaluations have always relied on 3 key sources of data, known as the 3 "P"s. The animals Pedigree, it's individual Phenotypes and it's Progeny phenotypes. All collected within defined contemporary groups. Using these 3 sources of data allows genetic evaluations to predict progeny performance for key economically relevant traits.

But genomics now provides a valuable fourth set of data for genetic evaluations and importantly, it's data that can be captured from non-parent animals.

Of the 4 key sources of data now used in most genetic evaluations, the most powerful source is progeny phenotypes. But having progeny information on young, non-parent animals is obviously not possible.

Which is why genomics is so exciting. It provides critical information that substantially increases accuracy on the non-parent sires breeders are looking to invest in and non-parent heifers they are considering retaining.

Genomics is also changing the way pedigrees are used in the analysis. Traditional genetic evaluations have always assumed that each of the animals 4 grand parents contributed 25% of its genetics. Whilst this is true on average, individual animals inherit varied amounts of DNA from each grandparent.



Figure 1: Pedigree based Inheritance provides an example demonstrating how the actual variation of inheritance from grandparents can look.

Genomics now gives genetic evaluations the ability to adjust the pedigree matrix used in calculations to more accurately reflect the pedigree inheritance of each genotyped animal, further increasing EPD accuracy. One way of measuring the effect of genomics is to use progeny equivalents.

As Table 1 shows, a genomic test in IGS is equivalent on average to:

- 25+ Calving Ease Direct progeny phenotypes
- 22 Birthweight progeny phenotypes
- 25+ Weaning weight & Yearling weight progeny phenotypes
- 15 Stayability phenotypes

Table 2 shows less impact than maternal and growth traits which reflects a smaller number of actual carcase data phenotypes in the evaluation compared to growth and maternal phenotypes. As more carcase records are added, you can expect the genomic impact to increase.

Having said that, it also makes genomics more important to use for carcase EPD accuracy.

A genomic test in IGS is equivalent on average to:

- 6 Carcase Weight phenotypes
- 10 Marble score phenotypes
- 8 Eye Muscle Area phenotypes
- 11 Rib Fat phenotypes



IGS CONTEMPORARY GROUPS

The Simmental breed now has populations from 4 countries (Australia, Canada, New Zealand and USA) all evaluated on one genetic evaluation platform, IGS. This not only makes the Simmental breed one of the largest breeds represented in IGS, but also one of the largest breed evaluation sets in the world.

More than just the sheer volume of pedigrees and phenotypes recorded, it's also the linkage of animals used across the 4 countries populations, combined with the high number of genotypes which means that the Simmental evaluations are backed by a lot of power.

Despite that, there are some simple steps that breeders can take to maximise the accuracy of their in herd EPD's.

One of the easiest ways to increase accuracy is through ensuring that Contemporary Groups (CG) are used correctly. Here are some simple steps to getting the most from your contemporary groups.

Different traits have different heritability, meaning that the amount of the trait that is influenced by genetics varies from trait to trait. Importantly though, only the genotype that influences that trait is heritable and can be passed on to an animals progeny; the environmental factors of an Individuals performance have no heritability at all. When animals that have been raised in different environments are compared together, it is impossible to know the difference between the genetic components and the environmental and management components. Selecting the highest performing animals in this situation is likely to only result in selecting animals that had an advantageous environment.

To understand the effect of the genotype on an animal's progeny, progeny are run under a similar environment within contemporary groups and their performance is measured. Given that the environmental component is similar for all animals in the contemporary group, the difference in the phenotypes (or variance), must be largely due to the effect of the genotype.

It is important that animals that have experienced different environmental factors, such as show cattle or sick or injured cattle, are grouped in their own contemporary groups, however breeders should also have strategies to maximise the size of their contemporary groupings.

So, here are 10 key points to help breeders maximise contemporary groupings:

- Every animal is assigned to a Birth CG at the start of its life. This group is assigned based on Breeder ID, a 90-day calving date window, sex of calf (M or F) and twin status.
- Contemporary groups (CG) are created based on what happened before the group was assigned, not after. So, animals are assigned to a weaning CG based on the group they were run in prior to weaning, not the group they will be run in after weaning.
- Breeders can set their own CG status for animals when Birth, Weaning, Yearling and Ultrasound records are taken, however these will not override the preset groups. Adding more CG's at any time, will only reduce the size of the original preset CG.
- 4. Once an animal is assigned a Birth CG, it never leaves that CG. So, combining animals from different Birth CG's after calving does not create a new Weaning CG for those animals. They will remain in their original Birth CG and then be split into a smaller CG based on the new Weaning CG supplied by the breeder.
- Animals within Weaning CG's need their weaning weights taken when animals are between 100 to 310 days of age. 160 to 250 days of age is ideal.
- Animals within Yearling CG's need their yearling weights taken when animals are between 270 to 500 days of age. 330 to 440 days of age is ideal.
- 7. Breeders should only apply new CG's when they are needed, such as if one group of animals are supplementary fed or run on another property. Animals run on the same property, on similar pasture at similar stocking rates and with similar management, should not be assigned different Birth CG's.

- 8. It is important to collect phenotypes on all animals within the CG, including the tail end. Taking measurements on selected animals only, will cause data bias that distort the CG. Not measuring the poor performing animals, will raise the remaining group average, making above average performing animals from the original group appear to be below average in the new group.
- 9. CG's work best when more than one sire is represented. If the CG contains progeny by only one sire, the CG will only be informative for the dams and their progeny. Only having one sire in the CG, means there are no other sires to compare that sires performance against.
- 10. Stayability CG's are formed using the Dam's Birth CG plus the Birth CG of the calf she

had as a 2-year-old. Animals are also placed in 90-day age windows based on average birth date. The Stayability count does not start until a female enters the herd as a first calving female at 2 years of age and then counts each subsequent calf she has. Therefore, culling females prior to registering their first calf, will not affect the Stayability scores of her parents.

Incorrect use of CG's results in data bias. Ideally, the larger the CG, the more animals within your herd that are compared to each other. That is not to say that breeders should not use contemporary groups where needed, but the important thing is to structure your recording so as to limit contemporary groupings across each drop. The more you can do this, the better genetic evaluation will work for both you and your clients.

CASA TORO 2025 ROMA BULL SALE

Buyers turned out in force for the 2025 Casa Toro Roma Bull Sale on Friday, September 12, where a 100 per cent clearance was achieved.

Vendors Scott and Claire York, along with children Tom and Zoe, presented 50 bulls, with the mix being predominantly traditional Simmental and 17 black Simmental bulls.

The draft averaged \$14,900, grossing \$745,000, which marked the highest average for the stud since 2022 and was 16.5pc higher than last year's average of \$12,787 and clearance of 95pc.

The top price of \$32,000 was paid by Middlemount producers Damian and Bec Finger from Fairlane Park Grazing for lot two, Casa Toro Ulan.

In comparison, last year saw a top of \$35,000 and gross of \$601,000.

The Fingers also purchased the second top-priced bull for \$30,000, lot 19, Casa Toro Ukrain, and secured lot 57 for \$14,000, giving them three picks from the catalogue.

"This is our first time buying here," Mrs Finger said. "I made sure we put it in the calendar for this year because I had wanted to come the year before, but we couldn't make it, so we made sure to make the trip this year.

"The temperament was the biggest thing we were chasing - they're going over our Droughtmaster-based herd and also some Brangus females. These were our three top picks, and we were fortunate enough to secure them all."

The Fingers currently run about 1500 breeders and said the bulls would complement their breeding direction.

The top-priced bull, Casa Toro Ulan, was a 23-month-old son of Casa Toro Q36 out of Billa Park Wine P87. He weighed 1020 kilograms, scanned 148 square centimetres for eye muscle area, 10mm for P8, 7mm for rib fat and 4.8pc intramuscular fat.

The second-top bull, also secured by the Fingers, was a 23-month-old son of Billa Park Notetaker N141 out of Casa Toro Q202

He weighed 950kg, scanned 145sq cm for EMA, 9mm P8, 6mm rib and 5.2pc IMF.

Dillon Scott from Yacamunda Investments, Collinsville, was the volume buyer of the day, taking home eight bulls for an average of \$14,625.

He said the line would head north to join their 14,000-cow breeding herd across 180,000 acres. "We purchased seven traditional bulls and one black bull, and they'll be going back over our Brahman and Charbray-based cows," Mr Scott said.

"It was a very consistent run of bulls, and they'll fit into our program well."

Mr Scott also purchased the top-priced black Simmental of the day, lot 41, Casa Toro Untouchable, for \$20,000.

Casa Toro stud principal Scott York described the result as both unexpected and pleasing.

"I was shocked, to be honest - it didn't feel as strong standing in the box as what it averaged, but it was a fantastic day," he said. "Our aim is always to breed bulls that will go out and work without any issues, carrying weight and muscle, but still soft enough to lay down fat. We're trying to produce genetics that give clients options, whether that's feeders, heifers or bullocks, so they can maximise their returns in whatever market they're in.

"I thought there might be a big difference between the traditional and the blacks, but they were very even on the day."

The York family plans to present a larger draft next year with an increased offering of black Simmentals.
